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FISCAL ANALYSIS

ASSUMPTION

Oversight notes this proposal states that no school district shall receive state aid under §163.031 (foundation formula) or any other state funding if such district holds classes during the Missouri State Fair. The Missouri State Fair is already scheduled for :

August 11, 2016 - August 21, 2016 (FY 2017) August 10, 2017 - August 20, 2017 (FY 2018) August 9, 2018 - August 19, 2018 (FY 2019)

Oversight notes that many school districts have also scheduled there school calendars for the next couple of years. Therefore, school districts that are currently scheduled to start before or during the Missouri State Fair will lose their state funding during the period of the fiscal note. Oversight will show the impact as Could exceed the estimate provided by the school districts (\$62,259,649)

Oversight notes that since the foundation formula is not fully funded, any loss by some districts of funding could result in other districts receiving the full amount owed. **Oversight** notes that DESE and the Office of Administration's Division of Budget and Planning were not able to provide Oversight with a projection of when the foundation formula may be fully funded. This proposal has a provision that may not have a fiscal impact until such time as the formula is fully funded. Oversight for fiscal note purposes is showing the impact of that provision as if the formula were fully funded.

Officials at the **Department of Agriculture** and the **Department of Elementary and Secondary Education** each assume there is no fiscal impact from this proposal to their respective departments.

Officials at the following school districts stated they start classes prior to or during the Missouri State Fair and therefore would lose the following amount of funding per this proposal if they don't change their start date:

Officials at the **Chilhowee**, **Kennett** and the **Kirbyville** school districts each assume a large unknown negative impact on their respective districts.

Officials at the **Kansas City Public Schools** assume no impact as long as additional restrictions governing school attendance, start and end dates are not implemented.

Officials at the **New Haven School District** assume this would result in a loss of \$2,000,000 if the district doesn't change its start date. However, moving back the start date would cause summer school to be shortened and the district will lose \$20,000 in revenue.

Officials at the **Renick School District** assume that they would lose funding for three days next year based on the start of school that is already scheduled.

Officials at the Shelby County R-IV School District assume this would change their start date.

Officials at the **Fredericktown**, **Macon County R-IV**, **Pettis County R-XII**, **Riverview Gardens**, **Seymour** and the **Warren County R-III** school districts each assume there is no fiscal impact from this proposal to their respective districts.

Officials at the **Bismarck**, **Richland** and the **Shell Knob** school districts each responded to Oversight's request for fiscal impact but did not indicate a fiscal impact.
