Bill Summary: This proposal changes the Uniform Arbitration Act regarding agreements

between employers and at-will employees.

Fiscal Analysis

Officials at the Office of Administration - Personnel, Department of Conservation, Department of Insurance, Financial Institutions and Professional Registration, Department of Labor and Industrial Relations, and Office of State Courts Administrator each assume no fiscal impact from this proposal to their respective organizations.

In response to a previous version, officials at **Department of Transportation** and **Attorney General's Office** each assumed the proposal would not have a fiscal impact on their respective organizations.

Oversight assumes this proposal could have an unknown impact on small businesses.
