FISCAL ANALYSIS

ASSUMPTION

Officials from the **Department of Public Safety - Missouri Highway Patrol** and the **Department of Corrections** each assume the proposal would not fiscally impact their respective agencies.

Officials from the **Attorney General's Office** assume that any potential costs arising from this proposal could be absorbed with existing resources.

Officials from the **Cole County Sheriff's Office** state there may be minimal fiscal impact as it applies to training. Additional costs occur as a Sheriff chooses to call on other counties for Deputy support.

Oversight assumes §57.111 is permissive to Sheriffs and will not reflect a fiscal impact to local counties.

In response to a previous version, officials from **St. Louis County**, **Springfield Police Department**, and the **Boone County Sheriff's Office** each assumed the proposal would not create a fiscal impact.
