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FISCAL ANALYSIS

ASSUMPTION

Oversight was unable to receive some of the agency responses in a timely manner due to the short fiscal note request time. Oversight has presented this fiscal note on the best current information that we have or on prior year information regarding a similar bill. Upon the receipt of agency responses, Oversight will review to determine if an updated fiscal note should be prepared and seek the necessary approval of the chairperson of the Joint Committee on Legislative Research to publish a new fiscal note.

Officials from the **Missouri Consolidated Health Care Plan (MCHCP)** assume this proposal does not fiscally impact their agency. The proposal legislation uses the provider definition from RSMo 376.1350 which does not include MCHCP.

Oversight assumes this proposal is relatively similar to SB 89 from the 2015 session. Each of the proposals require health carriers to file premium rates and classifications of risks with the Department of Insurance, Financial Institutions and Professional Registration (DIFP). In response to SB 89, DIFP assumed costs for FTE, as well as income from filing fees. For fiscal note purposes, Oversight will show a net fiscal impact of negative unknown, greater than \$100,000.
