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FISCAL ANALYSIS

ASSUMPTION

Oversight was unable to receive some of the agency responses in a timely manner due to the short fiscal note request time. Oversight has presented this fiscal note on the best current information that we have or on prior year information regarding a similar bill. Upon the receipt of agency responses, Oversight will review to determine if an updated fiscal note should be prepared and seek the necessary approval of the chairperson of the Joint Committee on Legislative Research to publish a new fiscal note.

Officials from the **Office of Administration** assume the proposal will have no fiscal impact on their organization.

Officials from the **Joint Committee on Administrative Rules** state this proposal is not anticipated to cause a fiscal impact beyond its current appropriation.

In response to proposals from 2016 with similar rules language, officials at the **Office of Secretary of State** stated that many bills considered by the General Assembly include provisions allowing or requiring agencies to submit rules and regulations to implement the act. The Secretary of State's office is provided with core funding to handle a certain amount of normal activity resulting from each year's legislative session. The fiscal impact for this fiscal note to Secretary of State's office for Administrative Rules is less than \$2,500. The Secretary of State's office recognizes that this is a small amount and does not expect that additional funding would be required to meet these costs. However, we also recognize that many such bills may be passed by the General Assembly in a given year and that collectively the costs may be in excess of what our office can sustain with our core budget. Therefore, we reserve the right to request funding for the cost of supporting administrative rules requirements should the need arise based on a review of the finally approved bills signed by the governor.

Oversight notes this proposal allows the Department of Transportation (MoDOT) to sell or lease naming rights for a particular segment of highway or for a bridge to the best qualified bidder, with the proceeds of the sale or lease being deposited into the State Road Fund. Oversight notes this proposal allows for the sale or lease of naming rights but does not require it. Oversight will reflect a fiscal impact of \$0 (no contracts issued for naming rights) or "Unknown" (contracts issued for naming rights) in FY 2017 and thereafter.

FISCAL IMPACT - Small Business

No direct fiscal impact to small businesses would be expected as a result of this proposal.

FISCAL DESCRIPTION

This proposal enables the Missouri Highways and Transportation Commission to issue requests for the sale or leasing of naming rights of particular highways or bridges. The sale or lease shall go to the best qualified bidder, and be approved by both the commission and the Joint Committee on Transportation Oversight. A naming rights contract or lease may be disapproved for any reason, and shall not exceed ten years in length. No naming rights may be sold or leased for any highway portion or bridge that has been designated as a memorial highway or bridge prior to August 28, 2016.

This legislation is not federally mandated, would not duplicate any other program and would not require additional capital improvements or rental space.
