FISCAL ANALYSIS

ASSUMPTION

Oversight was unable to receive some of the agency responses in a timely manner due to the short fiscal note request time. Oversight has presented this fiscal note on the best current information that we have or on prior year information regarding a similar bill. Upon the receipt of agency responses, Oversight will review to determine if an updated fiscal note should be prepared and seek the necessary approval of the chairperson of the Joint Committee on Legislative Research to publish a new fiscal note.

Oversight notes that current statutes require students from seventh grade through high school and college students to have instruction in the Constitutions of the United States and Missouri. This proposal would expand the instruction to also include the Bill of Rights, with its original intent and historical and current interpretations.

Officials at the **Department of Higher Education**, **Missouri State University**, **University of Central Missouri** and the **University of Missouri** each assume there is no fiscal impact from this proposal to their respective institution.

Officials at the **Department of Elementary and Secondary Education** assume there is no fiscal impact from this proposal.

Officials at the **Brentwood School District** assume \$320 for curriculum development.

Officials at the **St. Elizabeth School District** assume \$10,000 for posters, worksheets and materials.

Officials at the **Webster Groves School District** assume a one-time expense of \$5,000 for curriculum writing and professional development.

Officials at the East Newton, Eldon, Everton, Forsyth R-III, Macon County R-IV, Malta Bend, Monroe City R-I, New Haven, Special School District of St. Louis, West Plains, and the Wright City R-II school districts each assume there is no fiscal impact from this proposal to their respective districts.

Officials at the **Kingston 42 School District** and the **Pettis County R-XII School District** each assume no impact as they are K-8 districts.

<u>ASSUMPTION</u> (continued)

Oversight notes it is unable to determine how many schools and public higher education institutions currently teach the Bill of Rights. Oversight assumes that the Bill of Rights can be added to existing American Government or American History courses. Oversight assumes there may be some schools that would need to add to their curriculum but any change should be able to be absorbed within their existing resources. Oversight will not show a fiscal impact for this proposal.
