2 3	WHEREAS , the relationship between the United States and Cuba has been marked by tension, hostility, confrontation, and a fifty-plus year U.S. trade embargo that remains the longest standing embargo in modern history; and

5 6 7	WHEREAS, Cuba imports more than one billion dollars worth of food every year, including approximately 1.25 million tons of wheat, 500,000 tons of rice, 50,000 tons of poultry, and 75,000 tons of dairy products; and
8	
9 10 11	WHEREAS , Cuba's imports are expected to grow significantly as Cuba slowly recovers from the severe economic recession it has endured following the withdrawal of subsidies from the former Soviet Union; and
12	
13 14	WHEREAS, agriculture is the largest industry in Missouri and a leading employer of Missourians; and
15	
16 17	WHEREAS , Missouri ranks among the top ten states in production of many agricultural commodities, including soybeans, corn, and pork; and
18	
19 20	WHEREAS, Missouri ranks eleventh among all states in the overall value of its agricultural exports at approximately 4 billion dollars annually; and
21	
22 23 24	WHEREAS , since the Trade Sanctions Reform and Export Enhancement Act (TSRA) was implemented in 2000, the United States has exported nearly \$5 billion worth of agricultural products to Cuba; and

26 27 28	WHEREAS , the United States market share has recently declined due to increased competition from countries that can provide favorable credit terms that the United States is prohibited from offering and the prohibition against providing market development assistance

29 under the TSRA; and

30 **WHEREAS**, Missouri is positioned to benefit from the market opportunities that free 31 trade with Cuba would provide due to our agricultural abundance, transportation infrastructure, 32 and the consumer needs of the people of Cuba; and

WHEREAS, rather than depriving Cuba of agricultural products, the United States embargo only succeeds in driving sales to competitors in other countries that have no such restrictions; and

WHEREAS, the trade restrictions of the United States against Cuba hinder Missouri's
export of agricultural and food products; and

41 **WHEREAS**, full liberalization of trade between the United States and Cuba would 42 enable United States agricultural exports to compete on a more level playing field by allowing 43 the use of credit facilities, export and technical assistance, and market development programs:

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the members of the House of Representatives of the Ninety-eighth General Assembly, Second Regular Session, the Senate concurring therein, hereby urge the President and the United States Congress to consider the removal of trade restrictions relating to Cuba and work to restore trade relations between the United States and Cuba; and

51 **BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED** that the Chief Clerk of the Missouri House of 52 Representatives be instructed to prepare a properly inscribed copy of this resolution for the 53 President of the United States, the Speaker of the House of Representatives of the United States, 54 the President Pro Tempore of the United States Senate, and to all members of the Missouri 55 Congressional delegation.
