WHEREAS, Missourians are increasingly using new technologies, including 2 smartphones, in their daily lives; and 3 4 WHEREAS, that usage includes core day-to-day functions like working, banking, and 5 shopping; and 6 7 WHEREAS, increasing convenience for our residents is one way to improve 8 quality-of-life; and 9 10 WHEREAS, there is both a financial and environmental cost of producing plastic driver's licenses; and 11 12 13 **WHEREAS**, there is emerging technology that allows for secure, digital driver's licenses; 14 and 15 16 WHEREAS, numerous other states began experimenting with digital driver's licenses in 2015; and 17 18 19 WHEREAS, the digital driver's license would be optional, not required. 20 21 NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the members of the House of Representatives of the Ninety-eighth General Assembly, Second Regular Session, the Senate 22 23 concurring therein, hereby urge the the Motor Vehicle and Driver Licensing Division of the 24 Department of Revenue to study and consider issuing optional digital driver's licenses for 25 Missouri motorists; and 26 27 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Chief Clerk of the Missouri House of 28 Representatives be instructed to prepare a properly inscribed copy of this resolution for the 29 Director of the Department of Revenue.
