	WHEREAS, the Pentagon has revealed that a company with foreign ties has been
2	carrying out work on Air Force One and other VIP jets that ferry top United States politicians
3	around the world; and
4	
5	WHEREAS, GDC Technics had been servicing President Barack Obama's jet as a
6	contract for Boeing, according to the United States Air Force; and
7	
8	WHEREAS, said company was purchased in 2013, by MAZ Aviation, which is owned
9	by Saudi investor Mohammed Alzeer; and
10	
11	WHEREAS, according to the Air Force, along with Air Force One, said foreign
12	company also services the E-4B, which serves as an aerial national command post if there is a
13	national emergency or destruction on ground command and control centers; and
14	
15	WHEREAS, foreign ownership of facilities that the United States relies on has been ar
16	issue over the years; and
17	
18	WHEREAS, in 2006, Congress prevented the sale of United States port facilities to
19	Dubai Ports World of the United Arab Emirates because of concerns about foreign ownership
20	of key infrastructures; and
21	
22	WHEREAS, under a law passed in 2007, in light of the Dubai Ports World controversy
23	any acquisition of a United States company that could impact national security should be
24	reviewed by the Committee on Foreign Investment in the United States; and
25	
26	WHEREAS, it is unclear if the Committee on Foreign Investment in the United States
27	reviewed any contract between GDC Technics and MAZ Aviation; and

WHEREAS, it is certain that any work conducted on Air Force One or any aerial
national command post could impact national security:
NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the members of the House of
Representatives of the Ninety-eighth General Assembly, Second Regular Session, the Senate
concurring therein, hereby urge Congress to determine whether the Committee on Foreign
Investment in the United States reviewed any necessary contracts from said companies; and
BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Chief Clerk of the Missouri House of
Representatives be instructed to prepare a properly inscribed copy of this resolution for Majority
and Minority Leaders of the United States Senate and United States House of Representatives,
and each member of the Missouri Congressional delegation Missouri's congressional delegation.
