1 AMEND Senate Bill No. 8, Page 1, Section A, Line 2, by inserting immediately after all of said
2 section and line the following:

4 "302.171. 1. The director shall verify that an applicant for a driver's license is a Missouri
5 resident or national of the United States or a noncitizen with a lawful immigration status, and a
6 Missouri resident before accepting the application. The director shall not issue a driver's license for
7 a period that exceeds the duration of an applicant's lawful immigration status in the United States.
8 The director may establish procedures to verify the Missouri residency or United States
9 naturalization or lawful immigration status and Missouri residency of the applicant and establish the
10 duration of any driver's license issued under this section. An application for a license shall be made
11 upon an approved form furnished by the director. Every application shall state the full name, Social
12 Security number, age, height, weight, color of eyes, sex, residence, mailing address of the applicant,
13 and the classification for which the applicant has been licensed, and, if so, when and by what state,
14 and whether or not such license has ever been suspended, revoked, or disqualified, and, if revoked,
15 suspended or disqualified, the date and reason for such suspension, revocation or disqualification
16 and whether the applicant is making a one dollar donation to promote an organ donation program as
17 prescribed in subsection 2 of this section. A driver's license, nondriver's license, or instruction
18 permit issued under this chapter shall contain the applicant's legal name as it appears on a birth
19 certificate or as legally changed through marriage or court order. No name change by common
20 usage based on common law shall be permitted. The application shall also contain such information
21 as the director may require to enable the director to determine the applicant's qualification for
22 driving a motor vehicle; and shall state whether or not the applicant has been convicted in this or
23 any other state for violating the laws of this or any other state or any ordinance of any municipality,
24 relating to driving without a license, careless driving, or driving while intoxicated, or failing to stop
25 after an accident and disclosing the applicant's identity, or driving a motor vehicle without the
26 owner's consent. The application shall contain a certification by the applicant as to the truth of the
27 facts stated therein. Every person who applies for a license to operate a motor vehicle who is less
28 than twenty-one years of age shall be provided with educational materials relating to the hazards of
29 driving while intoxicated, including information on penalties imposed by law for violation of the
30 intoxication-related offenses of the state. Beginning January 1, 2001, if the applicant is less than
31 eighteen years of age, the applicant must comply with all requirements for the issuance of an
32 intermediate driver's license pursuant to section 302.178. For persons mobilized and deployed with
33 the United States Armed Forces, an application under this subsection shall be considered
34 satisfactory by the department of revenue if it is signed by a person who holds general power of
35 attorney executed by the person deployed, provided the applicant meets all other requirements set
36 by the director.

1 2. An applicant for a license may make a donation of one dollar to promote an organ donor
2 program. The director of revenue shall collect the donations and deposit all such donations in the
3 state treasury to the credit of the organ donor program fund established in sections 194.297 to
4 194.304. Moneys in the organ donor program fund shall be used solely for the purposes established
5 in sections 194.297 to 194.304 except that the department of revenue shall retain no more than one
6 percent for its administrative costs. The donation prescribed in this subsection is voluntary and may
7 be refused by the applicant for the license at the time of issuance or renewal of the license. The
8 director shall make available an informational booklet or other informational sources on the
9 importance of organ and tissue donations to applicants for licensure as designed by the organ
10 donation advisory committee established in sections 194.297 to 194.304. The director shall inquire
11 of each applicant at the time the licensee presents the completed application to the director whether
12 the applicant is interested in making the one dollar donation prescribed in this subsection and
13 whether the applicant is interested in inclusion in the organ donor registry and shall also specifically
14 inform the licensee of the ability to consent to organ donation by completing the form on the reverse
15 of the license that the applicant will receive in the manner prescribed by subdivision (1) of
16 subsection 1 of section 194.225. A symbol shall be placed on the front of the document indicating
17 the applicant's desire to be listed in the registry. The director shall notify the department of health
18 and senior services of information obtained from applicants who indicate to the director that they
19 are interested in registry participation, and the department of health and senior services shall enter
20 the complete name, address, date of birth, race, gender and a unique personal identifier in the
21 registry established in subsection 1 of section 194.304.

22 3. An applicant for a license may make a donation of one dollar to promote a blindness
23 education, screening and treatment program. The director of revenue shall collect the donations and
24 deposit all such donations in the state treasury to the credit of the blindness education, screening and
25 treatment program fund established in section 209.015. Moneys in the blindness education,
26 screening and treatment program fund shall be used solely for the purposes established in section
27 209.015; except that the department of revenue shall retain no more than one percent for its
28 administrative costs. The donation prescribed in this subsection is voluntary and may be refused by
29 the applicant for the license at the time of issuance or renewal of the license. The director shall
30 inquire of each applicant at the time the licensee presents the completed application to the director
31 whether the applicant is interested in making the one dollar donation prescribed in this subsection.

32 4. Beginning July 1, 2005, the director shall deny the driving privilege of any person who
33 commits fraud or deception during the examination process or who makes application for an
34 instruction permit, driver's license, or nondriver's license which contains or is substantiated with
35 false or fraudulent information or documentation, or who knowingly conceals a material fact or
36 otherwise commits a fraud in any such application. The period of denial shall be one year from the
37 effective date of the denial notice sent by the director. The denial shall become effective ten days
38 after the date the denial notice is mailed to the person. The notice shall be mailed to the person at
39 the last known address shown on the person's driving record. The notice shall be deemed received
40 three days after mailing unless returned by the postal authorities. No such individual shall reapply
41 for a driver's examination, instruction permit, driver's license, or nondriver's license until the period
42 of denial is completed. No individual who is denied the driving privilege under this section shall be
43 eligible for a limited driving privilege issued under section 302.309.

44 5. All appeals of denials under this section shall be made as required by section 302.311.

45 6. The period of limitation for criminal prosecution under this section shall be extended
46 under subdivision (1) of subsection 3 of section 556.036.

47 7. The director may promulgate rules and regulations necessary to administer and enforce
48 this section. No rule or portion of a rule promulgated pursuant to the authority of this section shall

1 become effective unless it has been promulgated pursuant to chapter 536.

2 8. Notwithstanding any provision of this chapter that requires an applicant to provide proof
3 of Missouri residency for renewal of a noncommercial driver's license, noncommercial instruction
4 permit, or nondriver's license, an applicant who is sixty-five years and older and who was
5 previously issued a Missouri noncommercial driver's license, noncommercial instruction permit, or
6 Missouri nondriver's license is exempt from showing proof of Missouri residency.

7 9. Notwithstanding any provision of this chapter, for the renewal of a noncommercial
8 driver's license, noncommercial instruction permit, or nondriver's license, a photocopy of an
9 applicant's United States birth certificate along with another form of identification approved by the
10 department of revenue, including, but not limited to, United States military identification or United
11 States military discharge papers, shall constitute sufficient proof of Missouri citizenship.

12 10. Notwithstanding any other provision of this chapter, if an applicant does not meet the
13 requirements of subsection 8 of this section and does not have the required documents to prove
14 Missouri residency, United States naturalization, or lawful immigration status, the department may
15 issue a one-year driver's license renewal. This one-time renewal shall only be issued to an applicant
16 who previously has held a Missouri noncommercial driver's license, noncommercial instruction
17 permit, or nondriver's license for a period of fifteen years or more and who does not have the
18 required documents to prove Missouri residency, United States naturalization, or lawful immigration
19 status. After the expiration of the one-year period, no further renewal shall be provided without the
20 applicant producing proof of Missouri residency, United States naturalization, or lawful immigration
21 status.

22 11. Notwithstanding any other provision of law, no later than January 2, 2018, the
23 department shall implement same-day service for license issuance and renewal in which an
24 applicant's license is printed in the individual license office and is issued to the applicant at the time
25 of his or her application."; and

27 Further amend said bill, Page 2, Section 307.175, Line 23, by inserting immediately after all of said
28 section and line the following:

30 "Section 1. Notwithstanding the provisions of section 307.350 or any other provision of law
31 to the contrary, a vehicle inspection of any type shall not be required for the issuance of a license
32 plate."; and

34 Further amend said bill and page, Section B, Lines 2-4, by deleting all of said lines and inserting in
35 lieu thereof the following:

37 "section 307.175 of section A of this act is deemed necessary for the immediate preservation of the
38 public health, welfare, peace and safety, and is hereby declared to be an emergency act within the
39 meaning of the constitution, and section 307.175 of section A of this act"; and

41 Further amend said bill by amending the title, enacting clause, and intersectional references
42 accordingly.
