1 AMEND House Committee Substitute for House Bill No. 151, Page 2, Section 302.065, Line 49, by
2 inserting after all of said line the following:

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4 "302.171. 1. The director shall verify that an applicant for a driver's license is a Missouri
5 resident or national of the United States or a noncitizen with a lawful immigration status, and a
6 Missouri resident before accepting the application. The director shall not issue a driver's license for
7 a period that exceeds the duration of an applicant's lawful immigration status in the United States.
8 The director may establish procedures to verify the Missouri residency or United States
9 naturalization or lawful immigration status and Missouri residency of the applicant and establish the
10 duration of any driver's license issued under this section. An application for a license shall be made
11 upon an approved form furnished by the director. Every application shall state the full name, Social
12 Security number, age, height, weight, color of eyes, sex, residence, mailing address of the applicant,
13 and the classification for which the applicant has been licensed, and, if so, when and by what state,
14 and whether or not such license has ever been suspended, revoked, or disqualified, and, if revoked,
15 suspended or disqualified, the date and reason for such suspension, revocation or disqualification
16 and whether the applicant is making a one dollar donation to promote an organ donation program as
17 prescribed in subsection 2 of this section. A driver's license, nondriver's license, or instruction
18 permit issued under this chapter shall contain the applicant's legal name as it appears on a birth
19 certificate or as legally changed through marriage or court order. No name change by common
20 usage based on common law shall be permitted. The application shall also contain such information
21 as the director may require to enable the director to determine the applicant's qualification for
22 driving a motor vehicle; and shall state whether or not the applicant has been convicted in this or
23 any other state for violating the laws of this or any other state or any ordinance of any municipality,
24 relating to driving without a license, careless driving, or driving while intoxicated, or failing to stop
25 after an accident and disclosing the applicant's identity, or driving a motor vehicle without the
26 owner's consent. The application shall contain a certification by the applicant as to the truth of the
27 facts stated therein. Every person who applies for a license to operate a motor vehicle who is less
28 than twenty-one years of age shall be provided with educational materials relating to the hazards of
29 driving while intoxicated, including information on penalties imposed by law for violation of the
30 intoxication-related offenses of the state. Beginning January 1, 2001, if the applicant is less than
31 eighteen years of age, the applicant must comply with all requirements for the issuance of an

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1 intermediate driver's license pursuant to section 302.178. For persons mobilized and deployed with
2 the United States Armed Forces, an application under this subsection shall be considered
3 satisfactory by the department of revenue if it is signed by a person who holds general power of
4 attorney executed by the person deployed, provided the applicant meets all other requirements set
5 by the director.

6 2. An applicant for a license may make a donation of one dollar to promote an organ donor
7 program. The director of revenue shall collect the donations and deposit all such donations in the
8 state treasury to the credit of the organ donor program fund established in sections 194.297 to
9 194.304. Moneys in the organ donor program fund shall be used solely for the purposes established
10 in sections 194.297 to 194.304 except that the department of revenue shall retain no more than one
11 percent for its administrative costs. The donation prescribed in this subsection is voluntary and may
12 be refused by the applicant for the license at the time of issuance or renewal of the license. The
13 director shall make available an informational booklet or other informational sources on the
14 importance of organ and tissue donations to applicants for licensure as designed by the organ
15 donation advisory committee established in sections 194.297 to 194.304. The director shall inquire
16 of each applicant at the time the licensee presents the completed application to the director whether
17 the applicant is interested in making the one dollar donation prescribed in this subsection and
18 whether the applicant is interested in inclusion in the organ donor registry and shall also specifically
19 inform the licensee of the ability to consent to organ donation by completing the form on the reverse
20 of the license that the applicant will receive in the manner prescribed by subdivision (1) of
21 subsection 1 of section 194.225. A symbol shall be placed on the front of the document indicating
22 the applicant's desire to be listed in the registry. The director shall notify the department of health
23 and senior services of information obtained from applicants who indicate to the director that they
24 are interested in registry participation, and the department of health and senior services shall enter
25 the complete name, address, date of birth, race, gender and a unique personal identifier in the
26 registry established in subsection 1 of section 194.304.

27 3. An applicant for a license may make a donation of one dollar to promote a blindness
28 education, screening and treatment program. The director of revenue shall collect the donations and
29 deposit all such donations in the state treasury to the credit of the blindness education, screening and
30 treatment program fund established in section 209.015. Moneys in the blindness education,
31 screening and treatment program fund shall be used solely for the purposes established in section
32 209.015; except that the department of revenue shall retain no more than one percent for its
33 administrative costs. The donation prescribed in this subsection is voluntary and may be refused by
34 the applicant for the license at the time of issuance or renewal of the license. The director shall
35 inquire of each applicant at the time the licensee presents the completed application to the director
36 whether the applicant is interested in making the one dollar donation prescribed in this subsection.

37 4. Beginning July 1, 2005, the director shall deny the driving privilege of any person who
38 commits fraud or deception during the examination process or who makes application for an
39 instruction permit, driver's license, or nondriver's license which contains or is substantiated with
40 false or fraudulent information or documentation, or who knowingly conceals a material fact or
41 otherwise commits a fraud in any such application. The period of denial shall be one year from the

1 effective date of the denial notice sent by the director. The denial shall become effective ten days
2 after the date the denial notice is mailed to the person. The notice shall be mailed to the person at
3 the last known address shown on the person's driving record. The notice shall be deemed received
4 three days after mailing unless returned by the postal authorities. No such individual shall reapply
5 for a driver's examination, instruction permit, driver's license, or nondriver's license until the period
6 of denial is completed. No individual who is denied the driving privilege under this section shall be
7 eligible for a limited driving privilege issued under section 302.309.

8 5. All appeals of denials under this section shall be made as required by section 302.311.

9 6. The period of limitation for criminal prosecution under this section shall be extended
10 under subdivision (1) of subsection 3 of section 556.036.

11 7. The director may promulgate rules and regulations necessary to administer and enforce
12 this section. No rule or portion of a rule promulgated pursuant to the authority of this section shall
13 become effective unless it has been promulgated pursuant to chapter 536.

14 8. Notwithstanding any provision of this chapter that requires an applicant to provide proof
15 of Missouri residency for renewal of a noncommercial driver's license, noncommercial instruction
16 permit, or nondriver's license, an applicant who is sixty-five years and older and who was
17 previously issued a Missouri noncommercial driver's license, noncommercial instruction permit, or
18 Missouri nondriver's license is exempt from showing proof of Missouri residency.

19 9. Notwithstanding any provision of this chapter, for the renewal of a noncommercial
20 driver's license, noncommercial instruction permit, or nondriver's license, a photocopy of an
21 applicant's United States birth certificate along with another form of identification approved by the
22 department of revenue, including, but not limited to, United States military identification or United
23 States military discharge papers, shall constitute sufficient proof of Missouri citizenship.

24 10. Notwithstanding any other provision of this chapter, if an applicant does not meet the
25 requirements of subsection 8 of this section and does not have the required documents to prove
26 Missouri residency, United States naturalization, or lawful immigration status, the department may
27 issue a one-year driver's license renewal. This one-time renewal shall only be issued to an applicant
28 who previously has held a Missouri noncommercial driver's license, noncommercial instruction
29 permit, or nondriver's license for a period of fifteen years or more and who does not have the
30 required documents to prove Missouri residency, United States naturalization, or lawful immigration
31 status. After the expiration of the one-year period, no further renewal shall be provided without the
32 applicant producing proof of Missouri residency, United States naturalization, or lawful immigration
33 status.

34 11. Notwithstanding any other provision of law, no later than January 2, 2019, the
35 department shall implement same-day service for license issuance and renewal in which an
36 applicant's license is printed in the individual license office and is issued to the applicant at the time
37 of his or her application."; and
