(5) attacks on the character or dignity of another, including but not limited to invasion of privacy, intrusion upon seclusion, libel, slander, public disclosure of private facts, false light publicity, misappropriation of name or likeness, false imprisonment, or harassment;
 (6) child abuse including intentional or negligent poisoning; (7) intentional or negligent infection of another with a sexually transmitted disease; (8) sexual misconduct;
(9) tortious interference with a contract, misappropriation of trade secrets, or trade libel;
