1 AMEND House Committee Substitute for Senate Bill No. 501, Page 3, Section 191.227, Line 70,  
2 by inserting the following after all of said section and line:

3  
4 "192.500. 1. For purposes of this section, the following terms shall mean:

5 (1) "Cone beam computed tomography system", a medical imaging device using x-ray  
6 computed tomography to capture data using a cone-shaped x-ray beam;

7 (2) "Panoramic x-ray system", an imaging device that captures the entire mouth in a single,  
8 two-dimensional image including the teeth, upper and lower jaws, and surrounding structures and  
9 tissues.

10 2. Cone beam computed tomography systems and panoramic x-ray systems that cannot  
11 produce radiation intensity greater than thirty milligrays shall not be required to be inspected more  
12 frequently than every three years.

13 3. Cone beam computed tomography systems that can produce radiation intensity of greater  
14 than thirty milligrays shall be inspected annually.

15 4. In addition to the requirements of subsections 2 and 3 of this section, all cone beam  
16 computed tomography systems and panoramic x-ray systems shall be inspected within thirty days of  
17 installation and whenever moved within an office.

18 5. Notwithstanding any law to the contrary, inspections of conventional x-ray equipment  
19 used exclusively on animals by a licensed veterinarian or veterinary facility under chapter 340 shall  
20 not be required to be inspected more frequently than every four years."; and

22 Further amend said bill, Page 7, Section 198.053, Line 9, by inserting immediately after said section  
23 and line the following:

24 "210.233. 1. All licensed child care facilities shall report annually to the department  
25 whether the child care facility has liability insurance coverage and if so, shall provide the  
26 department with proof of such insurance coverage.

27 2. The department shall publish and update annually on its website whether each licensed  
28 child care facility has liability insurance coverage. Upon request, the department shall provide  
29 insurance coverage information regarding a child care facility, including the name, address, and  
30 telephone number of the facility's liability insurance carrier.

31 3. The department may promulgate rules and regulations to implement the provisions of this  
32 section. Any rule or portion of a rule, as that term is defined in section 536.010, that is created  
33 under the authority delegated in this section shall become effective only if it complies with and is  
34 subject to all of the provisions of chapter 536 and, if applicable, section 536.028. This section and  
35 chapter 536 are nonseverable, and if any of the powers vested with the general assembly pursuant to  
36 chapter 536 to review, to delay the effective date, or to disapprove and annul a rule are subsequently

1 held unconstitutional, then the grant of rulemaking authority and any rule proposed or adopted after  
 2 August 28, 2017, shall be invalid and void."; and

 4 Further amend said bill, Page 7, Section 324.003, Line 13, by inserting immediately after said  
 5 section and line the following:

 7 "332.081. 1. Notwithstanding any other provision of law, hospitals licensed under chapter  
 8 197 shall be authorized to employ any or all of the following oral health providers:

9 (1) A dentist licensed under this chapter for the purpose of treating on hospital premises  
 10 those patients who present with a dental condition and such treatment is necessary to ameliorate the  
 11 condition for which they presented such as severe pain or tooth abscesses;

12 (2) An oral and maxillofacial surgeon licensed under this chapter for the purpose of treating  
 13 oral conditions that need to be ameliorated as part of treating the underlying cause of the patient's  
 14 medical needs including, but not limited to, head and neck cancer, HIV or AIDS, severe trauma  
 15 resulting in admission to the hospital, organ transplant, diabetes, or seizure disorders. It shall be a  
 16 condition of treatment that such patients are admitted to the hospital on either an in- or out-patient  
 17 basis;

18 (3) A maxillofacial prosthodontist licensed under this chapter for the purpose of treating and  
 19 supporting patients of a head and neck cancer team or other complex care or surgical team for the  
 20 fabrication of appliances following ablative surgery, surgery to correct birth anomalies, extensive  
 21 radiation treatment of the head or neck, or trauma-related surgery.

22 2. No person or other entity shall practice dentistry in Missouri or provide dental services as  
 23 defined in section 332.071 unless and until the board has issued to the person a certificate certifying  
 24 that the person has been duly registered as a dentist in Missouri or to an entity that has been duly  
 25 registered to provide dental services by licensed dentists and dental hygienists and unless and until  
 26 the board has issued to the person a license, to be renewed each period, as provided in this chapter,  
 27 to practice dentistry or as a dental hygienist, or has issued to the person or entity a permit, to be  
 28 renewed each period, to provide dental services in Missouri. Nothing in this chapter shall be so  
 29 construed as to make it unlawful for:

30 (1) A legally qualified physician or surgeon, who does not practice dentistry as a specialty,  
 31 from extracting teeth;

32 (2) A dentist licensed in a state other than Missouri from making a clinical demonstration  
 33 before a meeting of dentists in Missouri;

34 (3) Dental students in any accredited dental school to practice dentistry under the personal  
 35 direction of instructors;

36 (4) Dental hygiene students in any accredited dental hygiene school to practice dental  
 37 hygiene under the personal direction of instructors;

38 (5) A duly registered and licensed dental hygienist in Missouri to practice dental hygiene as  
 39 defined in section 332.091;

40 (6) A dental assistant, certified dental assistant, or expanded functions dental assistant to be  
 41 delegated duties as defined in section 332.093;

42 (7) A duly registered dentist or dental hygienist to teach in an accredited dental or dental  
 43 hygiene school;

44 (8) A duly qualified anesthesiologist or nurse anesthetist to administer an anesthetic in  
 45 connection with dental services or dental surgery; or

46 (9) A person to practice dentistry in or for:

47 (a) The United States Armed Forces;

48 (b) The United States Public Health Service;

(c) Migrant, community, or health care for the homeless health centers provided in Section 330 of the Public Health Service Act (42 U.S.C. 254(b));

(d) Federally qualified health centers as defined in Section 1905(l) (42 U.S.C. 1396d(l)) of the Social Security Act;

(e) Governmental entities, including county health departments; or

(f) The United States Veterans Bureau; or

(10) A dentist licensed in a state other than Missouri to evaluate a patient or render an oral, written, or otherwise documented dental opinion when providing testimony or records for the purpose of a civil or criminal action before any judicial or administrative proceeding of this state or other forum in this state.

[2]3. No corporation shall practice dentistry as defined in section 332.071 unless that corporation is organized under the provisions of chapter 355 or 356 provided that a corporation organized under the provisions of chapter 355 and qualifying as an organization under 26 U.S.C. Section 501(c)(3) may only employ dentists and dental hygienists licensed in this state to render dental services to Medicaid recipients, low-income individuals who have available income below two hundred percent of the federal poverty level, and all participants in the SCHIP program, unless such limitation is contrary to or inconsistent with federal or state law or regulation. This subsection shall not apply to:

(1) A hospital licensed under chapter 197 that provides care and treatment only to children under the age of eighteen at which a person regulated under this chapter provides dental care within the scope of his or her license or registration;

(2) A federally qualified health center as defined in Section 1905(l) of the Social Security Act (42 U.S.C. 1396(d)(l)), or a migrant, community, or health care for the homeless health center provided for in Section 330 of the Public Health Services Act (42 U.S.C. 254(b)) at which a person regulated under this chapter provides dental care within the scope of his or her license or registration;

(3) A city or county health department organized under chapter 192 or chapter 205 at which a person regulated under this chapter provides dental care within the scope of his or her license or registration;

(4) A social welfare board organized under section 205.770, a city health department operating under a city charter, or a city-county health department at which a person regulated under this chapter provides dental care within the scope of his or her license or registration;

(5) Any entity that has received a permit from the dental board and does not receive compensation from the patient or from any third party on the patient's behalf at which a person regulated under this chapter provides dental care within the scope of his or her license or registration;

(6) Any hospital nonprofit corporation exempt from taxation under Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code, as amended, that engages in its operations and provides dental services at facilities owned by a city, county, or other political subdivision of the state at which a person regulated under this chapter provides dental care within the scope of his or her license or registration.

If any of the entities exempted from the requirements of this subsection are unable to provide services to a patient due to the lack of a qualified provider and a referral to another entity is made, the exemption shall extend to the person or entity that subsequently provides services to the patient.

[3]4. No unincorporated organization shall practice dentistry as defined in section 332.071 unless such organization is exempt from federal taxation under Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended, and provides dental treatment without compensation from the

1 patient or any third party on their behalf as a part of a broader program of social services including  
 2 food distribution. Nothing in this chapter shall prohibit organizations under this subsection from  
 3 employing any person regulated by this chapter.

4 [4]5. A dentist shall not enter into a contract that allows a person who is not a dentist to  
 5 influence or interfere with the exercise of the dentist's independent professional judgment.

6 [5]6. A not-for-profit corporation organized under the provisions of chapter 355 and  
 7 qualifying as an organization under 26 U.S.C. Section 501(c)(3), an unincorporated organization  
 8 operating pursuant to subsection 3 of this section, or any other person should not direct or interfere  
 9 or attempt to direct or interfere with a licensed dentist's professional judgment and competent  
 10 practice of dentistry. Nothing in this subsection shall be so construed as to make it unlawful for not-  
 11 for-profit organizations to enforce employment contracts, corporate policy and procedure manuals,  
 12 or quality improvement or assurance requirements.

13 [6]7. All entities defined in subsection 2 of this section and those exempted under  
 14 subsection 3 of this section shall apply for a permit to employ dentists and dental hygienists licensed  
 15 in this state to render dental services, and the entity shall apply for the permit in writing on forms  
 16 provided by the Missouri dental board. The board shall not charge a fee of any kind for the issuance  
 17 or renewal of such permit. The provisions of this subsection shall not apply to a federally qualified  
 18 health center as defined in Section 1905(l) of the Social Security Act (42 U.S.C. 1396d(l)).

19 [7]8. Any entity that obtains a permit to render dental services in this state is subject to  
 20 discipline pursuant to section 332.321. If the board concludes that the person or entity has  
 21 committed an act or is engaging in a course of conduct that would be grounds for disciplinary  
 22 action, the board may file a complaint before the administrative hearing commission. The board  
 23 may refuse to issue or renew the permit of any entity for one or any combination of causes stated in  
 24 subsection 2 of section 332.321. The board shall notify the applicant in writing of the reasons for  
 25 the refusal and shall advise the applicant of his or her right to file a complaint with the  
 26 administrative hearing commission as provided by chapter 621.

27 [8]9. A federally qualified health center as defined in Section 1905(l) of the Social Security  
 28 Act (42 U.S.C. 1396d(l)) shall register with the board. The information provided to the board as  
 29 part of the registration shall include the name of the health center, the nonprofit status of the health  
 30 center, sites where dental services will be provided, and the names of all persons employed by, or  
 31 contracting with, the health center who are required to hold a license pursuant to this chapter. The  
 32 registration shall be renewed every twenty-four months. The board shall not charge a fee of any  
 33 kind for the issuance or renewal of the registration. The registration of the health center shall not be  
 34 subject to discipline pursuant to section 332.321. Nothing in this subsection shall prohibit  
 35 disciplinary action against a licensee of this chapter who is employed by, or contracts with, such  
 36 health center for the actions of the licensee in connection with such employment or contract. All  
 37 licensed persons employed by, or contracting with, the health center shall certify in writing to the  
 38 board at the time of issuance and renewal of the registration that the facility of the health center  
 39 meets the same operating standards regarding cleanliness, sanitation, and professionalism as would  
 40 the facility of a dentist licensed by this chapter. The board shall promulgate rules regarding such  
 41 standards.

42 [9]10. The board may promulgate rules and regulations to ensure not-for-profit corporations  
 43 are rendering care to the patient populations as set forth herein, including requirements for covered  
 44 not-for-profit corporations to report patient census data to the board. The provisions of this  
 45 subsection shall not apply to a federally qualified health center as defined in Section 1905(l) of the  
 46 Social Security Act (42 U.S.C. 1396d(l)).

47 [10]11. All not-for-profit corporations organized or operated pursuant to the provisions of  
 48 chapter 355 and qualifying as an organization under 26 U.S.C. Section 501(c)(3), or the

1 requirements relating to migrant, community, or health care for the homeless health centers  
2 provided in Section 330 of the Public Health Service Act (42 U.S.C. 254(b)) and federally qualified  
3 health centers as defined in Section 1905(l) (42 U.S.C. 1396d(l)) of the Social Security Act, that  
4 employ persons who practice dentistry or dental hygiene in this state shall do so in accordance with  
5 the relevant laws of this state except to the extent that such laws are contrary to, or inconsistent  
6 with, federal statute or regulation."; and

8 Further amend said bill by amending the title, enacting clause, and intersectional references  
9 accordingly.
