FISCAL ANALYSIS

ASSUMPTION

Officials at the **Office of the Attorney General** assume that any potential costs arising from this proposal can be absorbed with existing resources.

For the purpose of this proposed legislation, officials at the **Office of State Public Defender (SPD)** cannot assume that existing staff will provide effective representation for any indigent client faced with the DWI that could be prosecuted arising from that approximate 15-month period listed in the statute.

While the number of new cases may be too few or uncertain to request additional funding for this specific bill, the SPD will continue to request sufficient appropriations to provide effective representation.

Oversight assumes the SPD can absorb the additional caseload that may result from this proposal.

Officials at the **Office of the State Courts Administrator**, the **Department of Public Safety's Missouri Highway Patrol**, the **Department of Health and Senior Services**, the **Department of Revenue**, the **Missouri Department of Transportation** and the **Office of Prosecution Services** each assume no fiscal impact to their respective agencies from this proposal.

Officials at the **Callaway County Commission**, the **City of Kansas City**, the **City of Columbia** and the **City of Excelsior Springs** each assume no fiscal impact to their respective entities from this proposal.

FISCAL DESCRIPTION


The proposed legislation appears to have no direct fiscal impact.
