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FISCAL ANALYSIS

ASSUMPTION

Officials from the **Department of Public Safety** (**Director's Office** and **Missouri Highway Patrol**), the **Department of Natural Resources**, and the **Department of Social Services** each assume the proposal would not fiscally impact their respective agencies.

Officials from the **Missouri Department of Conservation (MDC)** estimate the proposal would have an unknown impact on MDC funds.

Officials from the **Springfield Police Department** assume the proposal would not fiscally impact their agency.

Officials from the **Cole County Sheriff's Department** assume this proposal may result in a slight reduction in labor, and would have a positive fiscal impact.

Officials from the **Boone County Sheriff's Department (BCSD)** assume the proposal would not fiscally impact their department. The BCSD noted that beginning in 2017, law enforcement is required to report continuing education training annually. It is no longer on a three year reporting cycle.

Officials from the **Department of Public Safety** state that after the POST Commission held six public hearings around the state, they are no longer on a three year/48 hours of POST certified continuing education training requirement. The education requirement effective January 1, 2017 is 24 hours of POST certified training every year, with an annual reporting.

Oversight will assume the proposal will not have a material fiscal impact to law enforcement agencies.
