## FISCAL ANALYSIS

### ASSUMPTION

Officials from the **Department of Revenue, Department of Transportation and Department of Economic Development - Public Service Commission** each assume the proposal will have no fiscal impact on their respective organizations.

Officials from the **Department of Public Safety - Missouri Highway Patrol (MHP)** assume the proposal will have no fiscal impact on their organization. MHP issued 449 citations in 2015 for violations of the “Move Over” law. The fine amount varies by county but is typically \$150 or greater.

**Oversight** assumes there could be an increase in citations issued by adding utility vehicles to the list of vehicles covered under the “Move Over” law; therefore, Oversight will reflect a minimal fiscal impact to local political subdivisions to account for the increase in fine revenue.

No direct fiscal impact to small businesses would be expected as a result of this proposal.

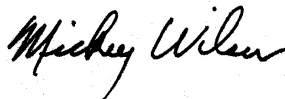
### FISCAL DESCRIPTION

This proposal adds stationary utility vehicles displaying lighted amber or amber and white lights to the list of emergency vehicles for which drivers of every motor vehicle must move over or slow down.

This legislation is not federally mandated, would not duplicate any other program and would not require additional capital improvements or rental space.
