FISCAL ANALYSIS

ASSUMPTION

Officials from the Office of Administration (OA), Commissioner's Office/Alternatives to Abortion Program state the Alternatives to Abortion program contracts with a number of organizations, including faith-based pregnancy resource centers, in order to provide pregnancy options counseling and other related pregnancy services. The Alternatives to Abortion program does not reimburse providers for medical or health care services, so the OA does not anticipate section 188.500 applying to its Alternatives to Abortion providers. However, if it is determined that this section does apply to Alternatives to Abortion providers, it is unknown how that will affect the number of organizations willing to provide Alternatives to Abortion services in the future and the department's ability to fully utilize funding appropriated for the Alternatives to Abortions program.

Alternatives to Abortion providers will be required to adhere to the provisions of section 191.762. However, the OA does not anticipate the use of Alternatives to Abortion funding for these organizations to comply with this section.

Officials from the **Office of Attorney General (AGO)** assume any potential costs arising from this proposal can be absorbed with existing resources.

Officials from the **Joint Committee on Administrative Rules (JCAR)** state the legislation is not anticipated to cause a fiscal impact to JCAR beyond its current appropriation.

Officials from the **Office of the Secretary of State (SOS)** state many bills considered by the General Assembly include provisions allowing or requiring agencies to submit rules and regulations to implement the act. The SOS is provided with core funding to handle a certain amount of normal activity resulting from each year's legislative session. The fiscal impact for this fiscal note to the SOS for Administrative Rules is less than \$2,500. The SOS recognizes that this is a small amount and does not expect that additional funding would be required to meet these costs. However, the SOS also recognizes that many such bills may be passed by the General Assembly in a given year and that collectively the costs may be in excess of what the office can sustain with the core budget. Therefore, the SOS reserves the right to request funding for the cost of supporting administrative rules requirements should the need arise based on a review of the finally approved bills signed by the governor.

Oversight assumes the SOS could absorb the costs of printing and distributing regulations related to this proposal. If multiple bills pass which require the printing and distribution of regulations at substantial costs, the SOS could request funding through the appropriation process.

Officials from the Department of Health and Senior Services, the Department of Insurance, Financial Institutions and Professional Registration, the Department of Mental Health, the Department of Public Safety, Missouri State Highway Patrol, the Department of Social Services, Division of Legal Services and MO HealthNet Division, the Missouri Consolidated Health Care Plan, the Missouri Department of Conservation, the Missouri Department of Transportation, the OA, Administrative Hearing Commission and the Columbia/Boone County Department of Public Health and Human Services each assume the proposal would not fiscally impact their respective agencies.
