FISCAL ANALYSIS

ASSUMPTION

Officials from the **Department of Natural Resources (DNR)** assume this proposal would require the General Assembly approval of lands to be acquired by the state. Once Department of Natural Resources - Missouri State Parks (MSP) intent to purchase land is common knowledge, DNR assumes it could drive up both interest and the price of acquiring land. For purposes of this fiscal note, MSP officials assume a 25 percent cost increase. The Missouri State Parks has spent an average of \$370,164 annually on land acquisitions (5 year average); therefore, MSP officials estimate a potential annual cost increase for land purchases of \$92,541.

Oversight assumes the Department of Natural Resources assumptions are speculative and will not reflect a fiscal impact to their organization.

Officials from the Office of Administration, Missouri House of Representatives, the Missouri Senate, the Department of Transportation and the Missouri Department of Conservation each assume the proposal will have no fiscal impact on their respective organizations.

Officials from the **Attorney General's Office** assume any potential cost arising from this proposal can be absorbed with existing resources.
