FISCAL ANALYSIS

ASSUMPTION

In response to the introduced version of this proposal, officials from the **University of Missouri Health Care (MUHC)** stated they had reviewed the proposed legislation and determined that the fiscal impact should not exceed \$100,000 annually.

In addition, in response to the introduced bill that appears to be very similar to House Amendment 1 (HB 381), officials from the **University of Missouri Health Care (UMHC)** stated they had reviewed the proposed legislation and determined that the fiscal impact should not exceed \$100,000 annually.

Oversight assumes the costs incurred by the UMHC related to this proposal, as amended, can be absorbed within current resource levels.

Officials from the **Department of Health and Senior Services**, the **Department of Mental Health**, the **Department of Social Services** and the **Office of State Courts Administrator** each assume the proposal would not fiscally impact their respective agencies.
