## **FISCAL ANALYSIS**

## **ASSUMPTION**

Officials at the **Office of Administration - General Services** assume that neither any state agency nor any state employee would violate the proposal. Therefore, it is assumed that no successful claims will be made against the Legal Expense Fund and the proposal would thus have no fiscal impact upon the Office of Administration—General Services. However, should that assumption prove incorrect, costs could be incurred by the Legal Expense Fund.

In response to a similar proposal from this session (HB 846), officials at the **Department of Labor and Industrial Relations** stated the Missouri Commission on Human Rights (MCHR) anticipates that it will receive additional complaints but assumes it can absorb the increase in complaints with existing resources. However, if the number of additional cases was significant or additional legislation was enacted which increased other types of MCHR complaints, the impact could be substantial enough that the MCHR could not absorb the additional work without additional resources and would request such through the appropriation process.

Officials at the Office of Administration - Budget and Planning, the Office of Administration - Personnel, the State Auditor's Office, the Department of Conservation, the Department of Corrections, the Department of Elementary and Secondary Education, the Missouri Ethics Commission, the Department of Insurance, Financial Institutions and Professional Registration, the Department of Mental Health, the Joint Committee on Administrative Rules, the Joint Committee on Public Employee Retirement, the Missouri State Employees' Retirement System, the Missouri Consolidated Health Care Plan, the Missouri Lottery Commission, the Missouri Senate, the Department of Natural Resources, the Office of Prosecution Services, the Missouri Tax Commission, the Department of Transportation, the Department of Public Safety - Highway Patrol, and the State Highway Employees Retirement System assume this proposal will not have a fiscal impact on their respective organizations.

In response to a similar proposal from this session (HB 846), officials at the Office of Administration - Administrative Hearing Commission, the Department of Agriculture, the Attorney General's Office, the Department of Public Safety - Gaming Commission, the Missouri House of Representatives, the Department of Health and Senior Services, the Department of Higher Education, the Governor's Office, the Lieutenant Governor's Office, the State Public Defender's Office, the Office of State Courts Administrator, the Department of Revenue, the State Treasurer's Office, the Department of Social Services, the Department of Public Safety - Alcohol and Tobacco, the Department of Public Safety - Capitol Police, the Department of Public Safety - Fire Safety Division, and the Department of Public Safety - Missouri Veterans Commission each assumed the proposal would not have a fiscal impact on their respective organizations.

Officials at the Metropolitan Community College, the Missouri State University, the Missouri Western State University, the Northwest Missouri State University, the Truman State University, the State Technical College of Missouri, the University of Central Missouri, and the University of Missouri each assume this proposal will not have a fiscal impact on their respective organizations.

Officials at the school district of **Forsyth R-III** assumes this proposal could have a negative fiscal impact on their organization.

**Oversight** will not show an impact to Forsyth R-III School District based on the assumption it can absorb any impact with current resources.
