Bill Summary: This proposal prohibits local school districts from setting an opening date for the school term that is more than 10 calendar days prior to the first Monday in September for school year 2018-2019 and for subsequent years.

FISCAL ANALYSIS

ASSUMPTION

Officials at the **Department of Elementary and Secondary Education** assume there is no fiscal impact from this proposal.

Officials at the **Wright City R-II School District** assume this could result in a loss of summer school (local control wants summer school to end prior to July 4th). This would average \$30,000.

Officials at the **Bronaugh School District** assume they would need to redo their schedule.

Officials at the **Forsyth R-III School District** assume this would have a negative impact.

Officials at the **Bakersfield R-IV, Kansas City, Kearney, Kirksville, Parkway, Pettis County R-XII** and the **West Plains** school districts each assume there is no fiscal impact from this proposal to their respective district.

Oversight notes this proposal would set the opening day of school districts at no earlier than ten calendar days prior to the first Monday in September. Oversight assumes school districts that currently start prior to ten calendar days prior to the first Monday in September would be required to delay their start date. Oversight assumes that this proposal does not change the length of the school day or the number of days in the school year so this proposal should not have a direct fiscal impact.

No direct fiscal impact to small businesses would be expected as a result of this proposal.


FISCAL DESCRIPTION
