FISCAL ANALYSIS

ASSUMPTION

Officials at the **Department of Higher Education** assume there is no fiscal impact from this proposal.

Officials at the **State Technical College of Missouri** assume this would have a large unknown impact. Additional staff would be required to collect data, maintain it and report it.

Officials at the **Metropolitan Community College** assume an additional \$50,000 in salaries to maintain the required information.

Officials at the Missouri State University assume a modest negative impact.

Officials at the **Missouri Western State University** and **St. Louis Community College** each assume there is no fiscal impact from this proposal to their respective institution.

Oversight notes this proposal, in §173.1004, would require the higher education institutions to post the cost of each degree program including all fees, expenses and tuition. The institution must include all salary information for that degree program. This information must be provided to all prospective students in writing prior to the student registering for classes. Oversight will show a cumulative impact to the higher education institutions of could exceed \$100,000 annually for the collection, updating and dissemination of this information.

Officials at the **Joint Committee on Administrative Rules** assume there is no fiscal impact from this proposal.

Officials from the **Office of the Secretary of State (SOS)** state many bills considered by the General Assembly include provisions allowing or requiring agencies to submit rules and regulations to implement the act. The SOS is provided with core funding to handle a certain amount of normal activity resulting from each year's legislative session. The fiscal impact for this fiscal note to the SOS for Administrative Rules is less than \$2,500. The SOS recognizes that this is a small amount and does not expect that additional funding would be required to meet these costs. However, the SOS also recognizes that many such bills may be passed by the General Assembly in a given year and that collectively the costs may be in excess of what the office can sustain with the core budget. Therefore, the SOS reserves the right to request funding for the cost of supporting administrative rules requirements should the need arise based on a review of the finally approved bills signed by the governor.

ASSUMPTION (continued)

Oversight assumes the SOS could absorb the costs of printing and distributing regulations related to this proposal. If multiple bills pass which require the printing and distribution of regulations at substantial costs, the SOS could request funding through the appropriation process.

Officials at the following colleges: Crowder, East Central Community College, Harris-Stowe, Jefferson College, Lincoln University, Moberly Area Community College, Missouri Southern State University, Northwest Missouri State University, Southeast Missouri State University, State Fair Community College, St. Charles Community College, Three Rivers Community College, Truman State University, University of Central Missouri and the University of Missouri did not respond to **Oversight's** request for fiscal impact.

FISCAL DESCRIPTION

Beginning with the fall 2018 semester, this bill requires any public institution of higher education to publish on their public website or in writing, at the time of acceptance or prior to registration, the estimated cost for each degree program offered, including required fees or expenses not included in the tuition.

This bill also requires approved institutions, as defined in §173.1102, to post on their website salary information for each degree program offered at such institution, using national occupational salary statistics complied by the United States Department of Labor's Bureau of Labor Statistics.

This legislation is not federally mandated, would not duplicate any other program and would not require additional capital improvements or rental space.
