FISCAL ANALYSIS

ASSUMPTION

In response to a similar proposal from 2016 (HB 2181), officials from the **Office of Administration - Facilities Management Design and Construction (OA-FMDC)** assumed, solely for purposes of this fiscal note response, that it would continue to provide facility management services and, when called for, design and construction services for the impacted state facilities in precisely the same manner as it currently does. OA-FMDC therefore assumes that the only change to its operations would be that functions now fulfilled by the Board of Public Buildings would, insofar as it related to the state facilities identified in the proposal, be carried out by the newly created State Capitol Complex Committee. If these assumptions prove incorrect, and the bill results in changes to the manner in which OA-FMDC provides services related to the state facilities identified in the bill, significant fiscal impacts may result.

Officials from the **Attorney General's Office** assumed that any potential costs arising from the proposal could be absorbed with existing resources.

Officials from the **Office of the Governor**, the **Missouri Senate** and the **Missouri Lieutenant Governor** each assume the current proposal would not fiscally impact their respective agencies.

In response to a similar proposal from 2016 (HB 2181), officials from the **Missouri House of Representatives** and the **Office of Administration (Commissioner's Office and Division of Accounting)** each assumed the proposal will have no fiscal impact on their respective organizations.

No direct fiscal impact to small businesses would be expected as a result of this proposal.


FISCAL DESCRIPTION
