### ASSUMPTION

Officials from the **Department of Natural Resources**, the **Office of the Lieutenant Governor** and the **Office of the Governor** each assume the proposal will have no fiscal impact on their respective organizations.

Officials from the **City of Independence (City)** assume there will be no fiscal impact to the City. Currently the City pays for all operations and maintenance for the facility referenced the proposal.

In response to a previous version, officials from the **Office of Administration** deferred to the Department of Natural Resources to estimate the fiscal impact of the proposed legislation on their organization.

In response to a similar proposal from this year (HB 204), officials from the **Attorney General's Office** assumed any potential cost arising from this proposal can be absorbed with existing resources.
