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#### FISCAL ANALYSIS

#### ASSUMPTION

Officials from the **Department of Insurance, Financial Institutions and Professional Registration (DIFP) - Office of Athletics** estimate there would be an additional 50 amateur events each year that would require investigation by Office of Athletics investigators. Additional FTE are not expected to be needed, but the Office of Athletics will incur additional travel costs, some with overnight stays, estimated at an average of \$274 per event at 50 events for 2 investigators at a total of \$27,400 in additional cost to the Office of Athletics Fund.

Officials from the **Office of the Secretary of State (SOS)** state many bills considered by the General Assembly include provisions allowing or requiring agencies to submit rules and regulations to implement the act. The SOS is provided with core funding to handle a certain amount of normal activity resulting from each year's legislative session. The fiscal impact for this fiscal note to the SOS for Administrative Rules is less than \$2,500. The SOS recognizes that this is a small amount and does not expect that additional funding would be required to meet these costs. However, the SOS also recognizes that many such bills may be passed by the General Assembly in a given year and that collectively the costs may be in excess of what the office can sustain with the core budget. Therefore, the SOS reserves the right to request funding for the cost of supporting administrative rules requirements should the need arise based on a review of the finally approved bills signed by the governor.

**Oversight** assumes the SOS could absorb the costs of printing and distributing regulations related to this proposal. If multiple bills pass which require the printing and distribution of regulations at substantial costs, the SOS could request funding through the appropriation process.

Officials from the **Department of Revenue** assume the proposal will have no fiscal impact on their organization.

Officials from the **Office of the Attorney General** did not respond to Oversight's request for fiscal impact for this proposal.
