AN ACT

To amend chapters 565 and 650, RSMo, by adding thereto three new sections relating to law enforcement officers, with a penalty provision.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the state of Missouri, as follows:

Section A. Chapters 565 and 650, RSMo, are amended by adding thereto three new 2 sections, to be known as sections 565.087, 650.520, and 650.522, to read as follows:

565.087. 1. As used in this section, "target" means knowingly causing serious physical injury to any person, or attempting to do so, because of the actual or perceived status of the person as a law enforcement officer, whether on duty or off duty.

4 2. Any person who intentionally targets a law enforcement officer shall be guilty 5 of a class A felony and, notwithstanding any other provision of law, shall not be eligible 6 for:

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(1) Suspended imposition of sentence or suspended execution of sentence; or

8 (2) Parole or conditional release until such person has served a minimum of ten 9 years of imprisonment.

650.520. 1. There is hereby created a statewide program called the "Blue Alert System" referred to in this section as the "system" to aid in the identification, location, and apprehension of any individual or individuals suspected of killing or seriously wounding any local, state, or federal law enforcement officer.

5 2. For the purposes of this section, "law enforcement officer" means any public 6 servant having both the power and duty to make arrests for violations of the laws of this 7 state, and federal law enforcement officers authorized to carry firearms and to make 8 arrests for violations of the laws of the United States.

EXPLANATION — Matter enclosed in bold-faced brackets [thus] in the above bill is not enacted and is intended to be omitted from the law. Matter in **bold-face** type in the above bill is proposed language.

9 3. The department of public safety shall develop regions to provide the system. The 10 department of public safety shall coordinate local law enforcement agencies and public 11 commercial television and radio broadcasters to provide an effective system. In the event 12 that a local law enforcement agency opts not to set up a system and a killing or serious 13 wounding of a law enforcement officer occurs within the jurisdiction, it shall notify the 14 department of public safety who will notify local media in the region.

4. The blue alert system shall include all state agencies capable of providing urgent and timely information to the public together with broadcasters and other private entities that volunteer to participate in the dissemination of urgent public information. At a minimum, the blue alert system shall include the department of public safety, highway patrol, department of transportation, and Missouri lottery.

5. The department of public safety shall have the authority to notify other regions upon verification that the criteria established by the oversight committee has been met.

6. Participation in a blue alert system is entirely at the option of local law enforcement agencies and federally licensed radio and television broadcasters.

Any person who knowingly makes a false report that triggers an alert under this
section is guilty of a class A misdemeanor.

650.522. 1. There is hereby created the "Blue Alert System Oversight Committee", 2 whose primary duty shall be to develop criteria and procedures for the blue alert system 3 and shall be housed within the department of public safety. The committee shall regularly 4 review the function of the blue alert system and revise its criteria and procedures in 5 cooperation with the department of public safety to provide for efficient and effective 6 public notification. As soon as practicable, the committee shall adopt criteria and 7 procedures to expand the Blue alert system to provide urgent public alerts related to homeland security, criminal acts, health emergencies, and other imminent dangers to the 8 9 public health and welfare.

10 2. The blue alert system oversight committee shall consist of ten members of which seven members shall be appointed by the governor with the advice and consent of the 11 12 senate. Such members shall represent the following entities: two representatives of the 13 Missouri Sheriffs' Association; two representatives of the Missouri Police Chiefs 14 Association; one representative of small market radio broadcasters; one representative of 15 large market radio broadcasters; one representative of television broadcasters. The 16 director of the department of public safety shall also be a member of the committee and 17 shall serve as chair of the committee. Additional members shall include two 18 representatives of the highway patrol.

3. Members of the oversight committee shall serve a term of four years; except that,
members first appointed to the committee shall have staggered terms of two, three, and
four years and shall serve until their successor is duly appointed and qualified.

4. Members of the oversight committee shall serve without compensation; except that, members shall be reimbursed for their actual and necessary expenses required for the discharge of their duties.

25 5. The blue alert system oversight committee shall promulgate rules for the 26 implementation of the blue alert system. Any rule or portion of a rule, as that term is 27 defined in section 536.010, that is created under the authority delegated in this section shall 28 become effective only if it complies with and is subject to all of the provisions of chapter 29 536 and, if applicable, section 536.028. This section and chapter 536 are nonseverable, and 30 if any of the powers vested with the general assembly pursuant to chapter 536 to review, 31 to delay the effective date, or to disapprove and annul a rule are subsequently held 32 unconstitutional, then the grant of rulemaking authority and any rule proposed or adopted 33 after August 28, 2017, shall be invalid and void.
