AN ACT

To repeal sections 590.030 and 590.050, RSMo, and to enact in lieu thereof two new sections relating to law enforcement officer continuing education requirements.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the state of Missouri, as follows:

Section A. Sections 590.030 and 590.050, RSMo, are repealed and two new sections 2 enacted in lieu thereof, to be known as sections 590.030 and 590.050, to read as follows:

590.030. 1. The POST commission shall establish minimum standards for the basic
training of peace officers. Such standards may vary for each class of license established pursuant
to subsection 2 of section 590.020.

2. The director shall establish minimum age, citizenship, and general education requirements and may require a qualifying score on a certification examination as conditions of eligibility for a peace officer license. Such general education requirements shall require completion of a high school program of education under chapter 167 or obtainment of a General Educational Development (GED) certificate.

9 3. The director shall provide for the licensure, with or without additional basic training, 10 of peace officers possessing credentials by other states or jurisdictions, including federal and 11 military law enforcement officers.

4. The director shall establish a procedure for obtaining a peace officer license and shallissue the proper license when the requirements of this chapter have been met.

14 5. As conditions of licensure, all licensed peace officers shall:

15 (1) Obtain continuing law enforcement education pursuant to rules to be promulgated 16 by the POST commission; and

17 (2) Maintain a current address of record on file with the director.

EXPLANATION — Matter enclosed in bold-faced brackets [thus] in the above bill is not enacted and is intended to be omitted from the law. Matter in **bold-face** type in the above bill is proposed language.

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18 6. Notwithstanding any other provision of this chapter or any rule promulgated by 19 the POST commission, beginning August 28, 2017, the reporting period for law enforcement continuing education requirements shall be extended from a three-year 20 21 reporting period to a five-year reporting period.

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7. A peace officer license shall automatically expire if the licensee fails to hold a commission as a peace officer for a period of five consecutive years, provided that the POST 23 commission shall provide for the relicensure of such persons and may require retraining as a 24 25 condition of eligibility for relicensure, and provided that the director may provide for the 26 continuing licensure, subject to restrictions, of persons who hold and exercise a law enforcement 27 commission requiring a peace officer license but not meeting the definition of a peace officer 28 pursuant to this chapter.

590.050. 1. The POST commission shall establish requirements for the continuing education of all peace officers. Peace officers who make traffic stops shall be required to receive 2 three hours of training within the law enforcement continuing education [three-year] five-year 3 4 reporting period concerning the prohibition against racial profiling and such training shall promote understanding and respect for racial and cultural differences and the use of effective, 5 noncombative methods for carrying out law enforcement duties in a racially and culturally 6 7 diverse environment.

8 2. The director shall license continuing education providers and may probate, suspend and revoke such licenses upon written notice stating the reasons for such action. Any person 9 aggrieved by a decision of the director pursuant to this subsection may appeal as provided in 10 chapter 536. 11

12 3. The costs of continuing law enforcement education shall be reimbursed in part by moneys from the peace officer standards and training commission fund created in section 13 14 590.178, subject to availability of funds, except that no such funds shall be used for the training 15 of any person not actively commissioned or employed by a county or municipal law enforcement 16 agency.

17 4. The director may engage in any activity intended to further the professionalism of 18 peace officers through training and education, including the provision of specialized training 19 through the department of public safety.

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
