## AN ACT

To repeal section 67.1364, RSMo, and to enact in lieu thereof one new section relating to tourism commissions.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the state of Missouri, as follows:

Section A. Section 67.1364, RSMo, is repealed and one new section enacted in lieu 2 thereof, to be known as section 67.1364, to read as follows:

67.1364. 1. Upon adoption of the tourism sales tax, there shall be established a tourism commission to consist of five members appointed by the governing body of the city or county. 2 Of these five members, one will be a representative of the hotel and motel industry and two shall 3 be active in the tourism industry; the remaining members of the commission will be members 4 of local general business interests in the city or county. One member of the city or county 5 governing body shall serve as liaison in a nonvoting capacity. If members of a tourism 6 commission are appointed by the governing body of a city, all members shall be a resident 7 8 of the city or county in which any part of the city is located. If members of a tourism 9 commission are appointed by the governing body of a county, all members shall be a 10 resident of such county. Members of the tourism commission will be appointed for a term of 11 three years; but, of the members first appointed, one shall be appointed for a term of one year, 12 two shall be appointed for a term of two years, and two shall be appointed for a term of three years. Members of the commission may serve no more than two consecutive terms. 13 The 14 members will serve without compensation.

2. The revenue received from the tax shall be deposited in a special fund and used solely
to promote tourism. The commission shall administer the moneys within the limits of the budget
approved by the city or county governing body.
