

HB 111 -- COLLECTIVE BARGAINING UNITS BI-STATE (Mathews)

COMMITTEE OF ORIGIN: Standing Committee on General Laws

This bill states it will allow a collective bargaining unit to independently represent different classes of workers within the bi-state development agency. This bill also states it will allow multiple collective bargaining units to exist within the bi-state development agency.

This bill requires labor disputes involving representation to be settled through arbitration. If any of these disputes arises in the operation of any public transportation service, such dispute must be submitted to an arbitration board, the composition of which is specified in the bill.

This bill is the same as HB 2587 (2016).
