

HB 442 -- SCHOOL DISTRICT SUBDISTRICTS

SPONSOR: Gray

This bill requires the Board of Election Commissioners to establish, within a county with a charter form of government and a population greater than 950,000, seven subdistricts for any school district that is within or adjoining another school district that itself is within, in whole or part, a street light maintenance district with a population less than 3,000. The commissioners will establish seven subdistricts for the purpose of electing directors of the first mentioned school district.

The bill requires the subdistrict boundaries to be drawn within 60 days after the effective date and within six months after each decennial census is reported to the President of the United States. The criteria for dividing the subdistricts are specified in the bill. If the commissioners cannot agree on the subdistrict boundaries by the deadlines the governing body of the county must draw the boundaries, as specified in the bill, and are not subject to veto by the chief executive of the county.

This bill requires all board members elected or appointed in any such district to be elected or appointed to represent one of the subdistricts, beginning with the first general municipal election or vacancy occurring after August 28, 2017. Each member must reside for one year prior to the date of his or her election in the subdistrict from which he or she is elected. The bill specifies how a vacancy will be filled.

The bill specifies that elected members of the board in office on August 28, 2017, shall hold office for the length of his or her elected term and a member appointed to fill a vacancy in office occurring after August 28, 2017, shall serve until the next general municipal election. A vacancy of the board will be filled as specified in the bill.

This bill is similar to HB 2762 (2016).
