AMEND House Bill No. 1409, Page 10, Section 288.060, Lines 36-52, by deleting all of said lines
and inserting in lieu thereof the following:
"5. (1) The duration of benefits payable to any insured worker during any benefit year shall
be limited to twenty weeks, subject to the following limitation that benefits shall be paid only for:
(a) Twenty successive weeks if the Missouri average unemployment rate is nine percent or
higher;
(b) Nineteen successive weeks if the Missouri average unemployment rate is between eight and one-half percent and nine percent;
(c) Eighteen successive weeks if the Missouri average unemployment rate is eight percent
up to and including eight and one-half percent;
(d) Seventeen successive weeks if the Missouri average unemployment rate is between
seven and one-half percent and eight percent;
(e) Sixteen successive weeks if the Missouri average unemployment rate is seven percent up
to and including seven and one-half percent;
(f) Fifteen successive weeks if the Missouri average unemployment rate is between six and
<u>one-half percent and seven percent;</u> (g) Fourteen successive weeks if the Missouri average unemployment rate is six percent up
to and including six and one-half percent; and
(h) Thirteen successive weeks if the Missouri average unemployment rate is below six
percent.
If an insured worker has been paid benefits for the maximum applicable duration of successive
weeks set forth in this subsection, but the insured worker has not yet reached the total yearly
maximum of twenty weeks, the insured worker shall not be eligible to file another claim for benefit
until he or she has waited at least six weeks. The Missouri average unemployment rate used to determine the duration of benefits payable to any insured worker shall be the Missouri average
unemployment rate as determined at the time benefits are sought by the insured worker."; and
