1 AMEND Senate Bill No. 819, Page 7, Section 210.487, Line 59, by inserting immediately after all of said  
2 section and line the following:

4 "210.1030. 1. There is hereby created the "Trauma-Informed Care for Children and Families  
5 Board", which shall enter into a public-private partnership to promote the healthy development of children  
6 and their families living in Missouri communities by promoting comprehensive trauma-informed children  
7 and family support systems and interagency cooperation.

8 2. The board shall be composed of the following members:

9 (1) The directors of the departments of elementary and secondary education, health and senior  
10 services, mental health, and social services;

11 (2) Six members from the private sector with knowledge of trauma-informed care methods, two of  
12 whom shall be appointed by the speaker of the house of representatives, one of whom shall be appointed by  
13 the minority leader of the house of representatives, two of whom shall be appointed by the president pro  
14 tempore of the senate, and one of whom shall be appointed by the minority leader of the senate;

15 (3) Two members of the house of representatives appointed by the speaker of the house of  
16 representatives and one member of the house of representatives appointed by the minority leader of the house  
17 of representatives; and

18 (4) Two members of the senate appointed by the president pro tempore of the senate and one  
19 member of the senate appointed by the minority leader of the senate.

20 3. The board shall use a competitive procurement process to form a public-private partnership. It  
21 may proceed with a project only if the board issues a request for proposals for the financing, development, or  
22 operation of the project on the board's own initiative.

23 4. The public-private partnership shall develop a training utilizing evidence-based and evidence-  
24 informed best practices with respect to:

25 (1) Early identification of children and youth and their families, as appropriate, who have  
26 experienced or are at risk of experiencing trauma;

27 (2) The expeditious referral of such children and youth and their families, as appropriate, who  
28 require specialized services to the appropriate trauma-informed support services, including treatment, in  
29 accordance with applicable privacy laws; and

30 (3) The implementation of trauma-informed approaches and interventions in child and youth-serving  
31 schools, organizations, homes, and other settings to foster safe, stable, and nurturing environments and  
32 relationships that prevent and mitigate the effects of trauma.

33 5. The training developed shall be disseminated to staff in all state-funded programs serving children  
34 and their families through the departments of elementary and secondary education, health and senior  
35 services, mental health, and social services."; and

37 Further amend said bill by amending the title, enacting clause, and intersectional references accordingly.
