2 Senate Bill No. 843, Page 2, Section 8.003, Lines 20-21, by deleting all of said lines and inserting  
3 in lieu thereof the following:

4 "[three] the first public [members term] member appointed after the effective date of this act  
5 shall be for two years, thereafter the [terms] term of all subsequently appointed public members";  
6 and

8 Further amend said bill, Page 5, Section 8.007, Line 61, by inserting immediately after said line the  
9 following:

10 "8.010. 1. The governor, attorney general and lieutenant governor constitute the board of  
11 public buildings. The governor is chairman and the lieutenant governor, secretary. The speaker of  
12 the house of representatives and the president pro tempore of the senate shall serve as ex officio  
13 members of the board but shall not have the power to vote. The board shall constitute a body  
14 corporate and politic. Except as provided under section 8.007, the board has general supervision  
15 and charge of the public property of the state at the seat of government, including the building  
16 located at 105 West Capitol Avenue in Jefferson City, and other duties imposed on it by law.

17 2. The commissioner of administration shall provide staff support to the board."; and

19 Further amend said bill and page, Section 29.415, Lines 1-5, by deleting said lines and section from  
20 the bill; and  
21

22 Further amend said bill, Pages 9-17, Section 105.955, Lines 1-272, by removing said section and  
23 lines and inserting in lieu thereof the following:

24 "109.221. 1. The state shall establish and administer a "State Historical Records Advisory  
25 Board". The state historical records advisory board shall consist of [twelve] seven members  
26 appointed by the governor, with the advice and consent of the senate. Each member shall serve for  
27 a term of three years, except for the first members appointed, which shall have four members that  
28 serve one year, four members that serve two years and four members that serve three years.  
29 Thereafter, each member shall serve three years. The secretary of state or his or her designee shall  
30 serve as chairman of the board and as the state historical records coordinator and his vote shall  
31 break any tie vote of the board. The executive director of the state historical society of Missouri  
32 shall serve as an ex officio member of the board. The board shall meet when called by the  
33 chairman, but shall meet at least annually. The board shall adopt written procedures to govern its  
34 activities. The board shall report annually to the general assembly on its activities.

35 2. The state historical records advisory board is assigned to the office of the secretary of  
36 state. Members of the board shall receive no compensation for their service, but shall be reimbursed

1 for their actual and necessary expenses incurred in the performance of their duties.

2 3. The board shall be the central advisory body for historical records planning and for  
3 projects relating to historic records developed and carried out within the state of Missouri. The  
4 board may perform duties such as sponsoring and publishing surveys of the conditions and needs of  
5 historical records in the state; soliciting or developing proposals for projects to be carried out in the  
6 state with the National Historical Publications and Records Commission, hereafter called  
7 "commission", financing; reviewing records proposals by institutions in the state and making  
8 recommendations from these to the commission; developing, revising, and submitting to the  
9 commission state priorities for historical records projects following guidelines developed by the  
10 commission; and reviewing, through reports and otherwise, the operation and progress of records  
11 projects in the state.

12 4. The board may seek funds available through the National Historical Publications and  
13 Records Commission for the subvention of all or part of the costs of printing and manufacturing  
14 volumes that have been formally endorsed by the commission.

15 5. The board may seek funds from the National Historical Publications and Records  
16 Commission for sponsoring and publishing surveys of the conditions and needs of historical records  
17 in the state; for soliciting or developing proposals for projects to be carried out in the state for  
18 preservation of historical records and publications; for reviewing records proposals by institutions in  
19 the state and making recommendations from these to the commission; and for developing, revising,  
20 and submitting to the commission state priorities for historical records projects following guidelines  
21 developed by the commission. The board may further carry out those necessary duties to fulfill its  
22 purpose of helping in the collection and preservation of Missouri's historical records and such other  
23 duties as may be prescribed by law.

24 6. The secretary of state, as state historical records coordinator, may fund and administer[  
25 ~~with the advice of the state historical records advisory board~~], grant requests for preservation of  
26 local records. In carrying out this subsection the secretary of state shall have the power to  
27 promulgate necessary rules and regulations. No rule or portion of a rule promulgated under the  
28 authority of this section shall become effective unless it has been promulgated pursuant to the  
29 provisions of section 536.024. Funds retained by the recorder of a county or a city not within a  
30 county and deposited in a recorder's fund for records preservation purposes pursuant to subsection 1  
31 of section 59.319 may be used by a recorder of a county or a city not within a county toward any  
32 local matching funds requirement for funding pursuant to the grant program authorized by this  
33 subsection. A recorder's application for grant funding pursuant to this subsection shall not be  
34 penalized in any way because local funds collected pursuant to subsection 1 of section 59.319 are to  
35 be used to fund any local matching funds requirement.

36 109.225. 1. There is hereby established the "Missouri Board on Geographic Names". The  
37 board shall be assigned for administrative purposes to the office of the secretary of state.

38 2. The board shall consist of nineteen members as follows:

39 (1) The secretary of state, who shall serve as chair of the board;

40 (2) ~~[Nine]~~ Eight citizens of Missouri appointed by the secretary of state;

41 (3) The director or the director's designee of the department of transportation;

42 (4) The director or the director's designee of the department of conservation;

43 (5) The director or the director's designee of the department of natural resources;

44 (6) The director or the director's designee of the department of agriculture;

45 (7) The commissioner or the commissioner's designee of the office of administration;

46 ~~[(7)]~~ (8) The director or the director's designee of the state archives;

47 ~~[(8)]~~ (9) The executive director or the executive director's designee of the state historical  
48 society of Missouri;

1       ~~[(9)]~~ (10) The director or the director's designee of the United States Geological Survey;  
 2       ~~[(10)]~~ (11) The director or the director's designee of the United States Forest Service; and  
 3       ~~[(11)]~~ (12) The director or the director's designee of the United States Corps of Engineers.

4       3. Appointed members of the board shall serve three-year terms and shall serve until their  
 5 successors are appointed. Vacancies on the board shall be filled in the same manner as the original  
 6 appointment and such member appointed shall serve the remainder of the unexpired term.

7       4. The board shall meet annually and as otherwise required by the secretary of state.

8       5. The board shall designate from its members a vice chair and shall adopt written  
 9 guidelines to govern the management of the board.

10       6. Each member of the board shall serve without compensation, but may be reimbursed for  
 11 their actual and necessary expenses incurred in the performance of their duties as members of the  
 12 board.

13       7. The secretary of state shall designate an employee of the secretary of state's office as  
 14 executive secretary for the board, who shall serve as a nonvoting member and shall maintain the  
 15 records of the board's activities and decisions and shall be responsible for correspondence between  
 16 the board and the United States Board on Geographic Names and other agencies.

17       8. The board shall:

18       (1) Receive and evaluate all proposals for changes in or additions to names of geographic  
 19 features and places in the state of Missouri to determine the most appropriate and acceptable names  
 20 for use in maps and official documents of all levels of government;

21       (2) Make official recommendations to the United States Board on Geographic Names on  
 22 behalf of the state of Missouri with respect to each proposal;

23       (3) Assist and cooperate with the United States Board on Geographic Names in matters  
 24 relating to names of geographic features and places in Missouri;

25       (4) Assist in the maintenance of a Missouri geographic names database as part of the  
 26 national database;

27       (5) Maintain a list of advisors who have special interest and knowledge in Missouri history,  
 28 geography, or culture and consult with such advisors on a regular basis in the course of the board's  
 29 deliberations;

30       (6) Develop and revise state priorities for geographic records projects following guidelines  
 31 of the United States Board on Geographic Names; and

32       (7) Submit a report on its activities annually to the general assembly.

33       9. The board may apply for moneys through federal and state grant programs to sponsor and  
 34 publish surveys of the condition and needs of geographic records in the state of Missouri and to  
 35 solicit or develop proposals for projects to be carried out in the state for preservation of geographic  
 36 records and publications.

37       109.255. 1. The secretary of state, or his or her designee, is hereby authorized to appoint  
 38 and serve as chairman of a local records board to advise, counsel, and judge what local records shall  
 39 be retained, copied, preserved, or disposed of and in what manner these functions shall be carried  
 40 out by the director. This board shall represent a wide area of public interest in local records and  
 41 shall consist of at least twelve members one of whom shall represent school boards, one  
 42 constitutional charter city, one third class city, one fourth class city, ~~[one village, one township, one~~  
 43 ~~for each class of county of the first and second class, one third or fourth class county, one higher~~  
 44 ~~education,]~~ one historical society, two of whom shall represent counties of the first or second  
 45 classification, two of whom shall represent counties of the third or fourth classification, and such  
 46 other members as the secretary of state shall direct.

47       2. The members of the board of record control shall serve staggered terms and may be  
 48 removed at the pleasure of the secretary of state.

1           3. The members of the board of control shall receive no salary but may be compensated for  
2 travel expenses if the budget of the secretary of state permits.

3           4. The board shall meet at such times as the chairman may call them.

4           5. The director with advice of the board of record control shall issue directives to guide  
5 local officials on the destruction of local records and nonrecord materials."; and

6  
7 Further amend said bill, Page 18, Section 143.1015, Line 32, by inserting after all of said section  
8 and line the following:

9           "181.022. 1. The secretary of state shall create the "Secretary's Council on Library  
10 Development" to advise the secretary of state and the state library on matters that relate to the state's  
11 libraries and library service to Missouri citizens, to recommend to the secretary of state and the state  
12 library policies and programs relating to libraries in the state, and to communicate the value of  
13 libraries.

14           2. Members of the secretary's council on library development shall serve three-year terms,  
15 to be served on a rotating basis as shall be established by the secretary of state.

16           3. The members of the secretary's council on library development shall be appointed by the  
17 secretary of state, to include [~~members of the house of representatives, members of the senate,~~]  
18 representatives of the public and of libraries, trustees of Missouri libraries, and users of the state  
19 libraries as well as members of the house of representatives, members of the senate, and the state  
20 librarian, who shall serve as ex-officio members of the council."; and

21  
22 Further amend said bill, Page 27, Section 194.408, Line 34, by inserting immediately after said line  
23 the following:

24           "195.070. 1. A physician, podiatrist, dentist, a registered optometrist certified to administer  
25 pharmaceutical agents as provided in section 336.220, or an assistant physician in accordance with  
26 section 334.037 or a physician assistant in accordance with section 334.747 in good faith and in the  
27 course of his or her professional practice only, may prescribe, administer, and dispense controlled  
28 substances or he or she may cause the same to be administered or dispensed by an individual as  
29 authorized by statute.

30           2. An advanced practice registered nurse, as defined in section 335.016, but not a certified  
31 registered nurse anesthetist as defined in subdivision (8) of section 335.016, who holds a certificate  
32 of controlled substance prescriptive authority from the board of nursing under section 335.019 and  
33 who is delegated the authority to prescribe controlled substances under a collaborative practice  
34 arrangement under section 334.104 may prescribe any controlled substances listed in Schedules III,  
35 IV, and V of section 195.017, and may have restricted authority in Schedule II. Prescriptions for  
36 Schedule II medications prescribed by an advanced practice registered nurse who has a certificate of  
37 controlled substance prescriptive authority are restricted to only those medications containing  
38 hydrocodone. However, no such certified advanced practice registered nurse shall prescribe  
39 controlled substance for his or her own self or family. Schedule III narcotic controlled substance  
40 and Schedule II - hydrocodone prescriptions shall be limited to a one hundred twenty-hour supply  
41 without refill.

42           3. A veterinarian, in good faith and in the course of the veterinarian's professional practice  
43 only, and not for use by a human being, may prescribe, administer, and dispense controlled  
44 substances and the veterinarian may cause them to be administered by an assistant or orderly under  
45 his or her direction and supervision.

46           4. A practitioner shall not accept any portion of a controlled substance unused by a patient,  
47 for any reason, if such practitioner did not originally dispense the drug, except as provided in  
48 section 195.265.

1           5. An individual practitioner shall not prescribe or dispense a controlled substance for such  
2 practitioner's personal use except in a medical emergency.

3           195.265. 1. Unused controlled substances may be accepted from ultimate users, from  
4 hospice or home health care providers on behalf of ultimate users to the extent federal law allows,  
5 or from any person lawfully entitled to dispose of a decedent's property if the decedent was an  
6 ultimate user who died while in lawful possession of a controlled substance, through:

7           (1) Collection receptacles, drug disposal boxes, mail back packages, and other means by a  
8 Drug Enforcement Agency-authorized collector in accordance with federal regulations, even if the  
9 authorized collector did not originally dispense the drug; or

10          (2) Drug take back programs conducted by federal, state, tribal, or local law enforcement  
11 agencies in partnership with any person or entity.

12  
13 This subsection shall supersede and preempt any local ordinances or regulations, including any  
14 ordinances or regulations enacted by any political subdivision of the state, regarding the disposal of  
15 unused controlled substances. For the purposes of this section, the term "ultimate user" shall mean a  
16 person who has lawfully obtained and possesses a controlled substance for his or her own use or for  
17 the use of a member of his or her household or for an animal owned by him or her or a member of  
18 his or her household.

19          2. By August 28, 2019, the department of health and senior services shall develop an  
20 education and awareness program regarding drug disposal, including controlled substances. The  
21 education and awareness program may include, but not be limited to:

22          (1) A web-based resource that:

23          (a) Describes available drug disposal options, including take back, take back events, mail  
24 back packages, in-home disposal options that render a product safe from misuse, or any other  
25 methods that comply with state and federal laws and regulations, may reduce the availability of  
26 unused controlled substances, and may minimize the potential environmental impact of drug  
27 disposal;

28          (b) Provides a list of drug disposal take back sites, which may be sorted and searched by  
29 name or location and is updated every six months by the department;

30          (c) Provides a list of take back events and mail back events in the state, including the date,  
31 time, and location information for each event and is updated every six months by the department;  
32 and

33          (d) Provides information for authorized collectors regarding state and federal requirements  
34 to comply with the provisions of subsection 1 of this section; and

35          (2) Promotional activities designed to ensure consumer awareness of proper storage and  
36 disposal of prescription drugs, including controlled substances."; and

37  
38 Further amend said bill, Page 45, Section 324.478, Line 49, by inserting immediately after said line  
39 the following:

40          "327.313. Applications for enrollment as a land surveyor-in-training shall be typewritten on  
41 prescribed forms furnished to the applicant. The application shall contain applicant's statements  
42 showing the applicant's education, experience, and such other pertinent information as the board  
43 may require[, including but not limited to three letters of reference, one of which shall be from a  
44 professional land surveyor who has personal knowledge of the applicant's land surveying education  
45 or experience]. Each application shall contain a statement that it is made under oath or affirmation  
46 and that the representations are true and correct to the best knowledge and belief of the applicant,  
47 subject to the penalties of making a false affidavit or declaration and shall be accompanied by the  
48 required fee.

1           327.321. Applications for licensure as a professional land surveyor shall be typewritten on  
2 prescribed forms furnished to the applicant. The application shall contain the applicant's statements  
3 showing the applicant's education, experience, results of prior land surveying examinations, if any,  
4 and such other pertinent information as the board may require~~[-, including but not limited to three~~  
5 ~~letters of reference from professional land surveyors with personal knowledge of the experience of~~  
6 ~~the applicant's land surveying education or experience]~~. Each application shall contain a statement  
7 that it is made under oath or affirmation and that its representations are true and correct to the best  
8 knowledge and belief of the person signing same, subject to the penalties of making a false affidavit  
9 or declaration and shall be accompanied by the required fee."; and

10  
11 Further amend said bill, Pages 58-59, Section 105.959, Lines 1-57, by removing said lines from the  
12 bill; and

13  
14 Further amend said bill, Page 68, Section B, Line 6, by inserting immediately after said line the  
15 following:

16           "Section C. Because immediate action is necessary to allow for the safe disposal of unused  
17 pharmaceuticals, the enactment of section 195.265 and the repeal and reenactment of section  
18 195.070 of this act is deemed necessary for the immediate preservation of the public health, welfare,  
19 peace, and safety, and is hereby declared to be an emergency act within the meaning of the  
20 constitution, and the enactment of section 195.265 and the repeal and reenactment of section  
21 195.070 of this act shall be in full force and effect upon its passage and approval."; and

23 Further amend said bill by amending the title, enacting clause, and intersectional references  
24 accordingly.
