5	"620.2700. 1. Subject to appropriation, the department of elementary and secondary education shall establish a statewide program to be known as the "STEM Career Awareness
6	Program" to increase STEM career awareness among students in grades six through eight. For
7	purposes of this section, "STEM" means science, technology, engineering, and mathematics.
8	2. The department of elementary and secondary education shall promote the statewide
9	program beginning in the 2019-20 school year. The program shall introduce students to a wide
10	variety of STEM careers and technology through an online-based STEM curriculum.
11	<u>3. Before January 1, 2019, the department of elementary and secondary education shall</u>
12	solicit proposals and select a provider for the online program. The program selected shall meet the
13	following criteria:
14	(1) The program introduces students to a wide variety of STEM careers and technologies,
15	including a curriculum explicitly focused on more than eighty different careers and technologies;
16	(2) The curriculum is organized around the concept of solving societal or human-centered
17	problems, instead of focusing solely on scientific concepts. The curriculum shall have at least ten
18	different problems that emphasize different career clusters;
19	(3) The curriculum is designed for flexible implementation in a wide variety of classrooms,
20	including science, math, English, and social studies, through lessons that emphasize the application
21	of STEM careers in these contexts;
22	(4) The curriculum demonstrates how math and language skills appropriate to middle
23	schools are used by STEM careers, making classroom instruction relevant to students interested in
24	STEM careers;
25	(5) The program uses game-based elements to encourage engagement and competition with
26	students and teams, including automated online leaderboards;
27	(6) The program rewards students, in the game format, for accomplishment in
28	demonstrating the application of math and language skills in the contexts of the STEM careers and
29	technologies;
30	(7) The program automatically produces analytic reports for individual students and for
31	classes, including analysis of performance against individual math and language skills objectives;
32	(8) The curriculum is available in a self-paced format over the internet, allowing access to
33	students through individual student accounts anywhere that the students can access the internet;
34	(9) The curriculum includes a narrative soundtrack accompanying and matching all
35	instructional text to assist students in developing reading skills in the context of STEM careers;
36	(10) The program has a validation from a national, third-party nonprofit organization that

6	secondary education may choose a third-party nonprofit entity to implement the statewide program,
7	solicit proposals, and select a provider as described under subsection 3 of this section.
8	5. (1) There is hereby created in the state treasury the "STEM Career Awareness Program
9	Fund". The fund shall consist of any appropriations, gifts, bequests, or public or private donations
10	to such fund. The state treasurer shall be custodian of the fund. In accordance with sections 30.170
11	and 30.180, the state treasurer may approve disbursements of public moneys in accordance with
12	distribution requirements and procedures developed by the department of elementary and secondary
13	education. The fund shall be a dedicated fund and, upon appropriation, moneys in the fund shall be
14	used solely for the administration of this section.
15	(2) Notwithstanding the provisions of section 33.080 to the contrary, any moneys remaining
16	in the fund at the end of the biennium shall not revert to the credit of the general revenue fund.
17	(3) The state treasurer shall invest moneys in the fund in the same manner as other funds are
18	invested. Any interest and moneys earned on such investments shall be credited to the fund.
19	6. The department of elementary and secondary education may promulgate all necessary
20	rules and regulations for the administration of this section. Any rule or portion of a rule, as that
21	term is defined in section 536.010, that is created under the authority delegated in this section shall
22	become effective only if it complies with and is subject to all of the provisions of chapter 536 and, if
23	applicable, section 536.028. This section and chapter 536 are nonseverable, and if any of the
24	powers vested with the general assembly pursuant to chapter 536 to review, to delay the effective
25	date, or to disapprove and annul a rule are subsequently held unconstitutional, then the grant of
26	rulemaking authority and any rule proposed or adopted after August 28, 2018, shall be invalid and
