1 AMEND House Committee Substitute for House Bill No. 2259, Page 2, Section 595.220, Line 40,
2 by deleting all of said line and inserting in lieu thereof the following:

4 "7. A victim under this section shall:

5 (1) Have any evidence obtained from an evidentiary collection kit preserved, without
6 charge, for the duration of the maximum applicable statute of limitations. If the state or any other
7 entity intends on destroying or disposing sexual assault evidence collected from an evidentiary
8 collection kit, or its probative contents, before the expiration of the maximum applicable statute of
9 limitations, such person shall, upon written request:

10 (a) Receive written notification no later than sixty days before the date of the intended
11 destruction or disposal; and

12 (b) Be granted further preservation of the evidentiary collection kit or its probative contents;

13 (2) Be informed of any results of an evidentiary collection kit, including a DNA profile
14 match, toxicology report, or other information collected as part of a medical forensic examination if
15 such disclosure would not impede or compromise an ongoing investigation; and

16 (3) Be informed in writing of any policies governing the collection and preservation of
17 evidence from an evidentiary collection kit.
