1 AMEND Senate Committee Substitute for Senate Bill No. 990, Page 1, Section A, Line 2, by  
2 inserting after all of said line the following:

3 "160.545. 1. There is hereby established within the department of elementary and  
4 secondary education the "A+ Schools Program" to be administered by the commissioner of  
5 education. The program shall consist of grant awards made to public secondary schools that  
6 demonstrate a commitment to ensure that:

7 (1) All students be graduated from school;

8 (2) All students complete a selection of high school studies that is challenging and for which  
9 there are identified learning expectations; and

10 (3) All students proceed from high school graduation to a college or postsecondary  
11 vocational or technical school or high-wage job with work place skill development opportunities.

12 2. The state board of education shall promulgate rules and regulations for the approval of  
13 grants made under the program to schools that:

14 (1) Establish measurable districtwide performance standards for the goals of the program  
15 outlined in subsection 1 of this section; and

16 (2) Specify the knowledge, skills and competencies, in measurable terms, that students must  
17 demonstrate to successfully complete any individual course offered by the school, and any course of  
18 studies which will qualify a student for graduation from the school; and

19 (3) Do not offer a general track of courses that, upon completion, can lead to a high school  
20 diploma; and

21 (4) Require rigorous coursework with standards of competency in basic academic subjects  
22 for students pursuing vocational and technical education as prescribed by rule and regulation of the  
23 state board of education; and

24 (5) Have a partnership plan developed in cooperation and with the advice of local business  
25 persons, labor leaders, parents, and representatives of college and postsecondary vocational and  
26 technical school representatives, with the plan then approved by the local board of education. The  
27 plan shall specify a mechanism to receive information on an annual basis from those who developed  
28 the plan in addition to senior citizens, community leaders, and teachers to update the plan in order to  
29 best meet the goals of the program as provided in subsection 1 of this section. Further, the plan  
30 shall detail the procedures used in the school to identify students that may drop out of school and  
31 the intervention services to be used to meet the needs of such students. The plan shall outline  
32 counseling and mentoring services provided to students who will enter the work force upon  
33 graduation from high school, address apprenticeship and intern programs, and shall contain  
34 procedures for the recruitment of volunteers from the community of the school to serve in schools  
35 receiving program grants.

36 3. Any nonpublic school in this state may apply to the state board of education for

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1 certification that it meets the requirements of this section subject to the same criteria as public high  
2 schools. Every nonpublic school that applies and has met the requirements of this section shall have  
3 its students eligible for reimbursement of postsecondary education under subsection 8 of this section  
4 on an equal basis to students who graduate from public schools that meet the requirements of this  
5 section. Any nonpublic school that applies shall not be eligible for any grants under this section.  
6 Students of certified nonpublic schools shall be eligible for reimbursement of postsecondary  
7 education under subsection 8 of this section so long as they meet the other requirements of such  
8 subsection. For purposes of subdivision (5) of subsection 2 of this section, the nonpublic school  
9 shall be included in the partnership plan developed by the public school district in which the  
10 nonpublic school is located. For purposes of subdivision (1) of subsection 2 of this section, the  
11 nonpublic school shall establish measurable performance standards for the goals of the program for  
12 every school and grade level over which the nonpublic school maintains control.

13 4. A school district may participate in the program irrespective of its accreditation  
14 classification by the state board of education, provided it meets all other requirements.

15 5. By rule and regulation, the state board of education may determine a local school district  
16 variable fund match requirement in order for a school or schools in the district to receive a grant  
17 under the program. However, no school in any district shall receive a grant under the program  
18 unless the district designates a salaried employee to serve as the program coordinator, with the  
19 district assuming a minimum of one-half the cost of the salary and other benefits provided to the  
20 coordinator. Further, no school in any district shall receive a grant under the program unless the  
21 district makes available facilities and services for adult literacy training as specified by rule of the  
22 state board of education.

23 6. For any school that meets the requirements for the approval of the grants authorized by  
24 this section and specified in subsection 2 of this section for three successive school years, by August  
25 first following the third such school year, the commissioner of education shall present a plan to the  
26 superintendent of the school district in which such school is located for the waiver of rules and  
27 regulations to promote flexibility in the operations of the school and to enhance and encourage  
28 efficiency in the delivery of instructional services in the school. The provisions of other law to the  
29 contrary notwithstanding, the plan presented to the superintendent shall provide a summary waiver,  
30 with no conditions, for the pupil testing requirements pursuant to section 160.257 in the school.  
31 Further, the provisions of other law to the contrary notwithstanding, the plan shall detail a means for  
32 the waiver of requirements otherwise imposed on the school related to the authority of the state  
33 board of education to classify school districts pursuant to subdivision (9) of section 161.092 and  
34 such other rules and regulations as determined by the commissioner of education, except such  
35 waivers shall be confined to the school and not other schools in the school district unless such other  
36 schools meet the requirements of this subsection. However, any waiver provided to any school as  
37 outlined in this subsection shall be void on June thirtieth of any school year in which the school fails  
38 to meet the requirements for the approval of the grants authorized by this section as specified in  
39 subsection 2 of this section.

40 7. For any school year, grants authorized by subsections 1, 2, and 5 of this section shall be  
41 funded with the amount appropriated for this program, less those funds necessary to reimburse  
42 eligible students pursuant to subsection 8 of this section.

43 8. The department of higher education shall, by rule, establish a procedure for the  
44 reimbursement of the cost of tuition, books and fees to any public community college or vocational  
45 or technical school or within the limits established in subsection 10 of this section for any two-year  
46 private vocational or technical school for any student:

47 (1) Who has attended a high school in the state for at least three years [~~immediately~~] prior to  
48 graduation that meets the requirements of subsection 2 of this section and who has graduated from

1 such a school; except that, students who are active duty military dependents, and students who are  
 2 dependants of retired military who relocate to Missouri within one year of the date of the parent's  
 3 retirement from active duty, who, in the school year immediately preceding graduation, meet all  
 4 other requirements of this subsection and are attending a school that meets the requirements of  
 5 subsection 2 of this section shall be exempt from the three-year attendance requirement of this  
 6 subdivision; and

7 (2) Who has made a good faith effort to first secure all available federal sources of funding  
 8 that could be applied to the reimbursement described in this subsection; and

9 (3) Who has earned a minimal grade average while in high school as determined by rule of  
 10 the department of higher education, and other requirements for the reimbursement authorized by  
 11 this subsection as determined by rule and regulation of the department; and

12 (4) Who is a citizen or permanent resident of the United States.

13 9. The commissioner of education shall develop a procedure for evaluating the effectiveness  
 14 of the program described in this section. Such evaluation shall be conducted annually with the  
 15 results of the evaluation provided to the governor, speaker of the house, and president pro tempore  
 16 of the senate.

17 10. For a two-year private vocational or technical school to obtain reimbursements under  
 18 subsection 8 of this section, the following requirements shall be satisfied:

19 (1) Such two-year private vocational or technical school shall be a member of the North  
 20 Central Association and be accredited by the Higher Learning Commission as of July 1, 2008, and  
 21 maintain such accreditation;

22 (2) Such two-year private vocational or technical school shall be designated as a 501(c)(3)  
 23 nonprofit organization under the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended;

24 (3) No two-year private vocational or technical school shall receive tuition reimbursements  
 25 in excess of the tuition rate charged by a public community college for course work offered by the  
 26 private vocational or technical school within the service area of such college; and

27 (4) The reimbursements provided to any two-year private vocational or technical school  
 28 shall not violate the provisions of Article IX, Section 8, or Article I, Section 7, of the Missouri  
 29 Constitution or the first amendment of the United States Constitution."; and

31 Further amend said bill, Page 2, Section 162.441, Line 41, by inserting after all of said line the  
 32 following:

34 Section B. Because of the importance of providing financial aid for Missouri high school  
 35 graduates, section 160.545 of this act is deemed necessary for the immediate preservation of the  
 36 public health, welfare, peace, and safety, and is hereby declared to be an emergency act within the  
 37 meaning of the constitution, and section 160.545 of this act shall be in full force and effect upon its  
 38 passage and approval."; and

40 Further amend said bill by amending the title, enacting clause, and intersectional references  
 41 accordingly.
