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FISCAL ANALYSIS

ASSUMPTION

Officials from the **Department of Public Safety - Office of the Director (DPS)** state they see no fiscal impact due to this legislation.

Oversight notes that according to information supplied by the DPS web site regarding the program, the maximum amount of funeral expenses that may be reimbursed through the Crime Victims Compensation Fund is \$5,000. In the past, the total pay-outs from the fund for funeral expenses have been:

Fiscal Year	Funeral Expenses
FY 2013	\$1,014,392
FY 2014	\$758,822
FY 2015	\$961,474

The balance of the Crime Victim's Compensation Fund (0681) at November 30, 2017 was \$8,688,118.

The maximum benefit including medical costs, wage loss, psychological counseling, funeral expenses, and support for dependent survivors is \$25,000. According to DPS budget submissions, the number of new Crime Victims Compensation claims was 1,539 in 2015, 1,725 in 2016, and 1,825 in 2017.

Oversight assumes the proposal would not increase the number of claimants to the Crime Victim's Compensation Fund, but rather would allow funeral homes to deal directly with DPS regarding expense reimbursement. Therefore, Oversight assumes the proposal would not have a direct fiscal impact to the fund. A notarized statement is required to be signed by the claimant.

Officials from the **Department of Revenue** and the **Department of Transportation** also assume the proposal would not fiscally impact their respective agencies.
