#### FISCAL ANALYSIS

#### **ASSUMPTION**

Officials from the **Department of Health and Senior Services (DHSS)** assume the proposal would not fiscally impact their agency.

Officials from the **Cooper County Public Health Department** state they are unable to calculate the potential costs to the Department of Health and Senior Services for the registry, but there will be a cost in developing, maintaining, sharing and working with law enforcement.

**Oversight** assumes the costs will not be significant since the DHSS assumed the proposal would not fiscally impact their organization.

Officials from the **Office of State Courts Administrator (OSCA)** state there may be some impact on the courts, but there is not way to currently quantify the impact. Any significant changes will be reflected in future budget requests.

Officials from the Department of Insurance, Financial Institutions and Professional Registration, the Department of Public Safety, the Missouri Office of Prosecution Services, the Office of State Public Defender and the Columbia/Boone County Department of Public Health and Human Services each assume the proposal would not fiscally impact their respective agencies.

Officials from the following health departments: Audrain County Health Unit, Cass County Health Department, Clay County Public Health Department, Harrison County Health Department and Hospice, Henry County Health Center, Hickory County Health Department, Howell County Health Department, City of Independence Health Department, Jefferson County Health Department, Knox County Health Department, Linn County Health Department, Madison County Health Department, Marion County Health Department, McDonald County Health Department, Miller County Health Center, Morgan County Health Center, Nodaway County Health Center, Platte County Health Department, Polk County Health Center, Pulaski County Health Center and Home Health Agency, Randolph County Health Department, Reynolds County Health Center, Ripley County Health Center, Shelby County Health Department, the St. Francois County Health Center and the St. Joseph Health Department did not respond to Oversight's request for a statement of fiscal impact.
