#### FISCAL ANALYSIS

#### ASSUMPTION

Officials from the **Office of the State Treasurer** assume the proposal will have no fiscal impact on their agency.

In response to a previous version, officials from the **Office of Prosecution Services** assumed no measurable fiscal impact. The creation of new crime creates additional responsibilities for county prosecutors, which may in turn result in additional costs which are difficult to determine.

Officials from the **Office of State Courts Administrator** assume the proposal may have some impact but there is no way to quantify that currently. Any significant changes will be reflected in future budget requests.

Officials from the **Office of the State Public Defender** and **Department of Corrections** both assume the proposal will have no fiscal impact on their respective organizations.

In response to a previous version, officials from the **Department of Public Safety-Office of the Director** assumed the proposal will have no fiscal impact on their organization.
