ASSUMPTION

Officials from the **Attorney General's Office (AGO)** assume any potential cost arising from this proposal can be absorbed with existing resources. AGO may seek additional appropriations if the proposal results in a significant increase in cases.

Officials from the **Office of Administration (Division of Purchasing and Materials Management, Facilities Management Design and Construction, General Services)** assume the proposal would not create a fiscal impact to their agencies.

Officials from the **Joint Committee on Administrative Rules** state this legislation is not anticipated to cause a fiscal impact beyond its current appropriation.

Officials from the **Department of Agriculture, Department of Elementary and Secondary Education, Department of Health and Senior Services, Department of Insurance, Financial Institutions and Professional Registration, Department of Mental Health, Department of Natural Resources, Department of Corrections, Department of Labor and Industrial Relations, Department of Revenue, Department of Public Safety (Office of the Director, Alcohol & Tobacco Control, Fire Safety, Gaming Commission, Missouri Highway Patrol, State Emergency Management Agency) Department of Social Services, Office of the Governor, Missouri Lottery Commission, Missouri Consolidated Health Care Plan, Missouri Department of Conservation, Office of the Lieutenant Governor, Office of Prosecution Services, Office of Administration (Administrative Hearing Commission and Budget and Planning), Office of the State Courts Administrator, Office of the State Auditor, Missouri Senate, Office of the State Public Defender, Office of the State Treasurer and the State Tax Commission** each assume the proposal will have no fiscal impact on their respective organizations.

This legislation is not federally mandated, would not duplicate any other program and would not require additional capital improvements or rental space.

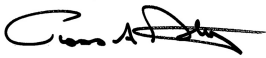
