FISCAL ANALYSIS

ASSUMPTION

Officials from the **Office of Administration (OA), General Services Division (GS)** assume that neither the Department of Mental Health nor any state employee or agency would violate the proposed legislation. Therefore, it is assumed that no successful claims will be made against the Legal Expense Fund and the legislation would thus have no fiscal impact upon the OA, GS. However, should that assumption prove incorrect, significant costs could be incurred by the Legal Expense Fund.

Officials from the **Department of Mental Health**, the **Department of Corrections**, the **Department of Social Services**, the **Missouri Office of Prosecution Services**, the **Office of State Courts Administrator** and the **Office of State Public Defender** each assume the proposal would not fiscally impact their respective agencies.

Oversight assumes the large fine (\$100,000) and imprisonment term (2 years) would dissuade individuals from using electroconvulsive therapy on persons under sixteen years of age. Therefore, Oversight will assume no fines or imprisonment from this proposal.
