FISCAL ANALYSIS

ASSUMPTION

In response to similar legislation from 2017, HCS for HB 1189, officials at the **City of Independence** assumed a loss in revenue of \$138,000 per year.

Oversight assumes there are other cities and counties who charge a fee on interior inspections of private residences through their local ordinances. However, Oversight is unclear on the number of cities and counties in the state that charge this fee. Therefore, Oversight will assume an unknown loss in revenues for this proposal.

Officials at the **Department of Economic Development** and the **State Tax Commission** each assume no fiscal impact to their respective agencies from this proposal.

Officials at St. Louis County, Boone County, the Callaway County Commission, the City of Springfield and the City of Kansas City each assume no fiscal impact to their respective entities from this proposal.

FISCAL IMPACT - Small Business

No direct fiscal impact to small businesses would be expected as a result of this proposal.

FISCAL DESCRIPTION

This bill prohibits a city or county from adopting or enforcing a residential property licensing ordinance that includes a requirement for periodic interior inspections of privately-owned residential property for city or county code violations. An occupant of privately-owned residential housing may request a city or county inspection at any time to determine code violations. A political subdivision cannot require a seller or transferor of real property to obtain an inspection or permit of the real property in order to sell or transfer the property.

This legislation is not federally mandated, would not duplicate any other program and would not require additional capital improvements or rental space.
