ASSUMPTION

Officials from the **Attorney General's Office (AGO)** assume that any potential costs arising from this proposal could be absorbed with existing resources. The AGO states they may seek additional appropriations if there is a significant increase in litigation.

In response to a similar proposal from this year (SB 616) officials from the **Boone County Sheriff's Department** assumed the proposal would not fiscally impact their respective agencies.

In response to a similar proposal from 2017 (HB 586), officials from the **Springfield Police Department** assumed no impact.

Officials from the Joplin Police Department, the Lake Saint Louis Fire District, the St. Charles Police Department, and the St. Louis Metropolitan Police Department did not respond to **Oversight's** request for fiscal impact.
