#### FISCAL ANALYSIS

# ASSUMPTION

Officials from the **Department of Elementary and Secondary Education (DESE)** assume the proposal will have no fiscal impact on their organization. DESE defers to local school districts.

In response to a pervious version, HB 2332 (LR 5485-01), officials from the **Kirksville R-III School District** assumed this proposal would have a limited negative fiscal impact on the district.

In response to a pervious version, HB 2332 (LR 5485-01), officials from the **Wellsville-Middletown R-1 School District** and **Summersville R2 School District** assumed the proposal would have no fiscal impact on their districts.

**Oversight** notes this proposal raises the amount for which school districts are required to advertise in a newspaper for the construction of facilities from more than \$15,000 to more than \$50,000. Oversight assumes there could be a limited savings to school districts that are no longer required to advertise in the newspaper for certain projects. Oversight will show a fiscal impact of \$0 (no qualifying projects) to an unknown savings.

# FISCAL IMPACT - Small Business

No direct fiscal impact to small businesses would be expected as a result of this proposal.

## FISCAL DESCRIPTION

Currently, any school district authorizing the construction of facilities that may cost more than \$15,000 must advertise in a newspaper and comply with certain bidding requirements. This bill raises threshold for the construction of facilities to projects that cost more than \$50,000.

This legislation is not federally mandated, would not duplicate any other program and would not require additional capital improvements or rental space.
