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#### FISCAL ANALYSIS

#### ASSUMPTION

Officials from the **Missouri Department of Conservation (MDC)** assume the proposal will have no fiscal impact on their organization.

MDC notes the following violations were issued in CY 2017:

**Oversight** notes from MDC's website that a point system is used to assist staff in identifying serious and repeat offenders of the Wildlife Code. Points are assigned to offenses based on the severity of the violation. When a violation occurs, an MDC agent will issue a ticket. If there is a conviction, the court may assess a fine (which goes to the county) and/or time in jail.

Based upon the number of violations listed above and that restitution may or may not be required, Oversight will reflect a positive "Could exceed \$100,000" fiscal impact for revenue associated with poaching fines and restitution.

Officials from the **Department of Natural Resources** and **Department of Agriculture** each assume the proposal will have no fiscal impact on their respective organizations.

Officials at the **Office of the State Courts Administrator** assume the fiscal impact of this proposal is unknown. There may be some impact but there is no way to quantify the impact at this time. Any significant changes will be reflected in future budget requests.

Officials from the **Kirksville R-III School District** assume this proposal could have a slight positive fiscal impact.

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# ASSUMPTION (continued)

Officials from the **Summersville R-2 School District** assume this proposal will have a positive fiscal impact.

Officials from the **West Plains Schools** assume the proposal will have no fiscal impact on their organization.

In response to a previous version, officials from the **Northeast Nodaway R-5 School District** assumed the proposal would have no fiscal impact on their organization.

#### FISCAL IMPACT - Small Business

#### FISCAL DESCRIPTION

This bill specifies that any person convicted of chasing, pursuing, taking, transporting, killing, processing, or disposing of certain wildlife in violation of the Missouri Conservation Commission's rules and regulations may be required to pay restitution to the state. The moneys collected will be transferred to the State School Moneys Fund.

This legislation is not federally mandated, would not duplicate any other program and would not require additional capital improvements or rental space.
