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FISCAL ANALYSIS

ASSUMPTION

Officials at the **Joplin Police Department (JPD)** assume there would be no fiscal impact on the JPD provided the home agency of the responding officer would still bear the responsibility of workers compensation and liability. If this is incorrect, then the workers compensation and liability portion of the proposal in section 44.098.5 would fall on the agency requesting the assistance. In this case, this proposal would have a negative fiscal impact on the JPD if assistance is requested and one of the responding officers from another agency was hurt or sued while assisting the JPD.

Oversight inquired the Department of Labor and Industrial Relations (DOLIR) for their interpretation of section 44.098.5. According to DOLIR, the liability and workers' compensation portion of this section would lie with the home agency. Therefore, Oversight will show no direct fiscal impact for this proposal.

Officials at the **Office of the State Courts Administrator** assume there may be some impact but there is no way to quantify that currently. Any significant changes will be reflected in future budget requests.

Officials at **Legislative Research** assume no fiscal impact from this proposal.

In response to a previous version, the **Department of Public Safety's Missouri Highway Patrol** assumed no fiscal impact from this proposal.

Officials at the **Jasper County Sheriff's Department** assume no fiscal impact from this proposal.

Officials at the counties of Jasper and Newton did not respond to **Oversight's** request for fiscal impact.
