#### FISCAL ANALYSIS

#### **ASSUMPTION**

**Oversight** assumes this proposal allows the governing boards of institutions of higher education to designate a faculty or staff member as a campus protection officer. The responsibilities of the designated campus protection officer are voluntary and are in addition to the normal responsibilities of the faculty or staff member. Any compensation for duties performed as a campus protection officer are to be funded by the institution of higher education.

**Oversight** assumes members seeking designation as a campus protection officer are to submit a certificate of completion from a campus protection officer training program approved by the director of the Department of Public Safety. The Department of Public Safety is to maintain a list of all persons designated as campus protection officers.

Officials from the **Department of Public Safety**, **Department of Higher Education** and **State Technical College of Missouri** assume the proposal will have no fiscal impact on their organizations.

In response to a previous version, HB 1942 (LR 5659-01), officials from the **University of Central Missouri** and **Missouri State University** assumed the proposal will have no fiscal impact on their organizations.

**Oversight** assumes this proposal is permissive and will not show a fiscal impact to public institutions of higher education.

Officials from the **Joint Committee on Administrative Rules** assume this proposal is not anticipated to cause a fiscal impact beyond its current appropriation.

Officials from the **Office of the Secretary of State (SOS)** state many bills considered by the General Assembly include provisions allowing or requiring agencies to submit rules and regulations to implement the act. The SOS is provided with core funding to handle a certain amount of normal activity resulting from each year's legislative session. The fiscal impact for this fiscal note to the SOS for Administrative Rules is less than \$2,500. The SOS recognizes that this is a small amount and does not expect that additional funding would be required to meet these costs. However, the SOS also recognizes that many such bills may be passed by the General Assembly in a given year and that collectively the costs may be in excess of what the office can sustain with the core budget. Therefore, the SOS reserves the right to request funding for the cost of supporting administrative rules requirements should the need arise based on a review of the finally approved bills signed by the governor.

# ASSUMPTION (continued)

**Oversight** assumes the SOS could absorb the costs of printing and distributing regulations related to this proposal. If multiple bills pass which require the printing and distribution of regulations at substantial costs, the SOS could request funding through the appropriation process.
