FISCAL ANALYSIS

ASSUMPTION

Officials at the **Department of Corrections (DOC)** assume an unknown savings from this proposal. The DOC state it could reduce the potential pay out on punitive damages for medical or for other reasons should the DOC get sued.

Due to the speculative nature, **Oversight** will range the impact to DOC from \$0 to the unknown savings.

Officials at the **Office of the State Courts Administrator** assume there may be some impact but there is no way to quantify that currently. Any significant changes will be reflected in future budget requests.

Officials at the **Office of the Attorney General (AGO)** assume that any potential costs arising from this proposal can be absorbed with existing resources. The AGO may seek additional appropriations if there is a significant increase in litigation.

Officials at the Department of Health and Senior Services, the Department of Social Services, the Department of Mental Health, the Department of Labor and Industrial Relations, the Department of Insurance, Financial Institutions and Professional Registration, the Office of the State Public Defender and the Office of Prosecution Services each assume no fiscal impact to their respective agencies from this proposal.

FISCAL IMPACT - Small Business

No direct fiscal impact to small businesses would be expected as a result of this proposal.

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FISCAL DESCRIPTION

This bill provides that punitive damages shall not be awarded except upon proof by clear and convincing evidence that the defendant intentionally caused harm or acted with a conscious disregard for the safety of others. Punitive damages may not be awarded against an employer or principal because of the conduct of an employee or agent unless specified criteria are met.

The bill prohibits any initial pleading from containing a claim for a punitive damage award. A claimant may amend a pleading with leave of court based upon evidence providing a reasonable basis for the recovery of punitive damages. The bill repeals a provision of law that allows a judge to apply the doctrines of remittitur and additur to a punitive damage award. The provisions of this section apply to any civil action pending on August 28, 2018, or filed on or after August 28, 2018 (Section 510.259, RSMo).

This bill provides that punitive damages may be awarded against a health care provider in a malpractice action only if the plaintiff proves by clear and convincing evidence that the defendant intentionally caused damage to the plaintiff or demonstrated malicious misconduct (Sections 538.205 & 538.210).

This legislation is not federally mandated, would not duplicate any other program and would not require additional capital improvements or rental space.
