FISCAL ANALYSIS

ASSUMPTION

Oversight was unable to receive some of the agency responses in a timely manner due to the short fiscal note request time. Oversight has presented this fiscal note on the best current information that we have or on prior year information regarding a similar bill. Upon the receipt of agency responses, Oversight will review to determine if an updated fiscal note should be prepared and seek the necessary approval of the chairperson of the Joint Committee on Legislative Research to publish a new fiscal note.

Officials at the **City of Kansas City** assume this legislation will have a negative fiscal impact on the City due to lost revenues of approximately \$10,000 annually because the legislation would impact City business license revenues associated with circuses, carriage rides and exotic animal shows.

Oversight assumes there could be other potential revenues lost in other local political subdivisions annually from this proposal. Oversight will show an amount greater than \$10,000 in revenues lost on business licenses for this proposal.

Officials at the **Department of Agriculture** assume no fiscal impact from this proposal.

FISCAL DESCRIPTION


Under this act, the General Assembly preempts the control and regulation of working animals to the exclusion of any order, ordinance, policy, or regulation by any political subdivision. For purposes of this act, "working animal" means the use of any animal for the purpose of performing a specific duty or function in business, commerce, or service, including but not limited to, animals in entertainment.

This legislation is not federally mandated, would not duplicate any other program and would not require additional capital improvements or rental space.
