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### FISCAL ANALYSIS

### ASSUMPTION

In response to a previous version, HB 2284 (LR 6065-01), officials from the **Department of Higher Education** assumed the proposal will have no fiscal impact on their organization.

Officials from the **Office of the State Courts Administrator** assume there may be some impact but there is no way to quantify that currently. Any significant changes will be reflected in future budget requests.

Officials from the **Office of the Attorney General (AGO)** assume that any potential costs arising from this proposal can be absorbed with exiting resources. The AGO may seek additional appropriations if there is a significant increase in litigation.

Officials from **Missouri State University** assume this proposal will have no substantial fiscal impact for the university.

Officials from the **Missouri Western State University** and **State Technical College of Missouri** assume the proposal will have no fiscal impact on their organizations.

In response to a previous version, HB 2284 (LR 6065-01), officials from the **St. Charles Community College** assumed this proposal may require additional costs for the college depending on the number of events and the number of participants at the events. The costs are unknown at this time.

In response to a previous version, HB 2284 (LR 6065-01), officials from **Northwest Missouri State University** assumed there may be some initial legal fees and training costs for the university, but no other ongoing costs.

In response to a previous version, HB 2284 (LR 6065-01), officials from the **University of Central Missouri** assumed the proposal would have no fiscal impact on their organization.

**Oversight** assumes that should this proposal require a college or university to modify their existing policy it can be done with their current resources. Oversight assumes the colleges and universities will ensure their policies comply with statutes so no penalties would be awarded. Oversight assumes this proposal would not have a direct fiscal impact.

## FISCAL IMPACT - Small Business

No direct fiscal impact to small businesses would be expected as a result of this proposal.

#### FISCAL DESCRIPTION

This bill modifies the Campus Free Expression Act. The bill requires the governing board of each public institution of higher education to adopt a policy on free expression by January 1, 2019. The free expression policy must be consistent with several principles of free speech specified in the bill. The free expression policy shall be made available to students and faculty annually.

The bill also requires institutions to adopt a "student-on-student harassment" policy defining the term no more expansively than unwelcome conduct that is discriminatory on a basis that is designated by the educational institutions or provided by law and that is so severe that it effectively bars the victim's equal access to resources and opportunities.

The bill shall not be interpreted as prohibiting an institution from imposing restrictions on expression that do not violate the United States Constitution or the Missouri Constitution.

This legislation is not federally mandated, would not duplicate any other program and would not require additional capital improvements or rental space.
